Novice Rams split series

Acton's Richard Raju had a good night, scoring two goals and earning one assist. Raju was in on all

the big scores for his team, netting a tying goal at the end of the first period, the eventual winning goal in the third end and assisting on the insurance goal after that.

David Lajeunesse, Sandy Chapman and Kyle Arten also contributed for the home side, with Lajeunesse scoring two and Chapman and Arten each getting two assists.

Jason Christopher and Andrew Coe scored the other two Acton goals in a game that was played

cautiously by all, since the floor was slightly slippery due to the humidity.

The Rams finished up their regular season with their last game tonight at the Acton Arena against Orangeville. The playoffs are due to start the first week of August.

In Tyke Division, the Acton team defeated Arthur 6-3 at home last Wednesday, thanks to a three goal night by Ryan Wetherall.

Wetherall waited for his opportunities, scoring all three of his markers consecutively in the final two periods, while the Arthur squad failed to respond.

Marty Gordon helped out Acton with a goal and an assist, as did Brandon Valeme and Mathew Hall, who each scored once.

The Bugs Bunny and Mickey Mouse teams of the Acton House League Peanut Division squared off for two games recently, with the Mousers finding themselves on the short end of the stick.

Hoosiers destroyed by 21 team errors

The Firestone Halton Hills Hoosiers self-destructed in a pair of games last week. Monday, they committed a dozen errors to hand Brampton an easy 16-1 victory. And on Thursday, the team made 9 errors on the way to a 16-6 loss.

The game at Brampton started off well enough. Playing with irregulars at several positions, Firestone grabbed a quick lead in the 1st on back-to-back doubles by Tammy Richard and Sherie Peacock.

The team escaped damage for 2 innings, despite committing 3 errors. But in the 3rd, 3 walks and 4 errors helped Brampton to cash 6 runs and take control of the game.

Shannon Morris took the loss, allowing 2 earned runs and 7 walks and 4 hits over 4 innings of work.

On Thursday, Firestone hosted the Cawthra Carleys. Playing with a regular lineup, the team committed 4 errors to help the Carleys to 9 runs in the 1st inning.

Firestone got 3 of those back in their half of the inning. Morris singled and Kelly Ambrose gained base on an error. One out later, Richard produced a run-scoring single, and Sherie Peacock followed with a blast over the left-fielder for a stand-up triple. It was 9-3.

Cawthra got those 3 back in the next inning, with the help of a 2-out error which allowed 2 runners to cross home. In the bottom of the inning, Lisa Harlow led off the inning with a wrong-field home run down the left-field foul line. It was 12-4.

Cawthra extended their lead by 3 more in the next inning. In the bottom of the 4th, Firestone closed the gap a bit with a pair of runs.

Harlow walked, and Andrea Leeking and Morris had back-to-back singles to load the bases.

Ambrose then singled to drive in a pair of runs, but this was as close as Firestone would get. Cawthra added 1 more run in the 6th, to make the final score 16-6.

Ambrose took the loss allowing 4 earned runs in the 1st inning. Mor-

ris pitched 6 innings of relief and allowed 4 earned runs. Defensive play of the game was executed by Harlow, who made a fine running catch in centre field.

Next week's action includes Firestone's first trip of the season to Streetsville, and a visit by Brampton.
