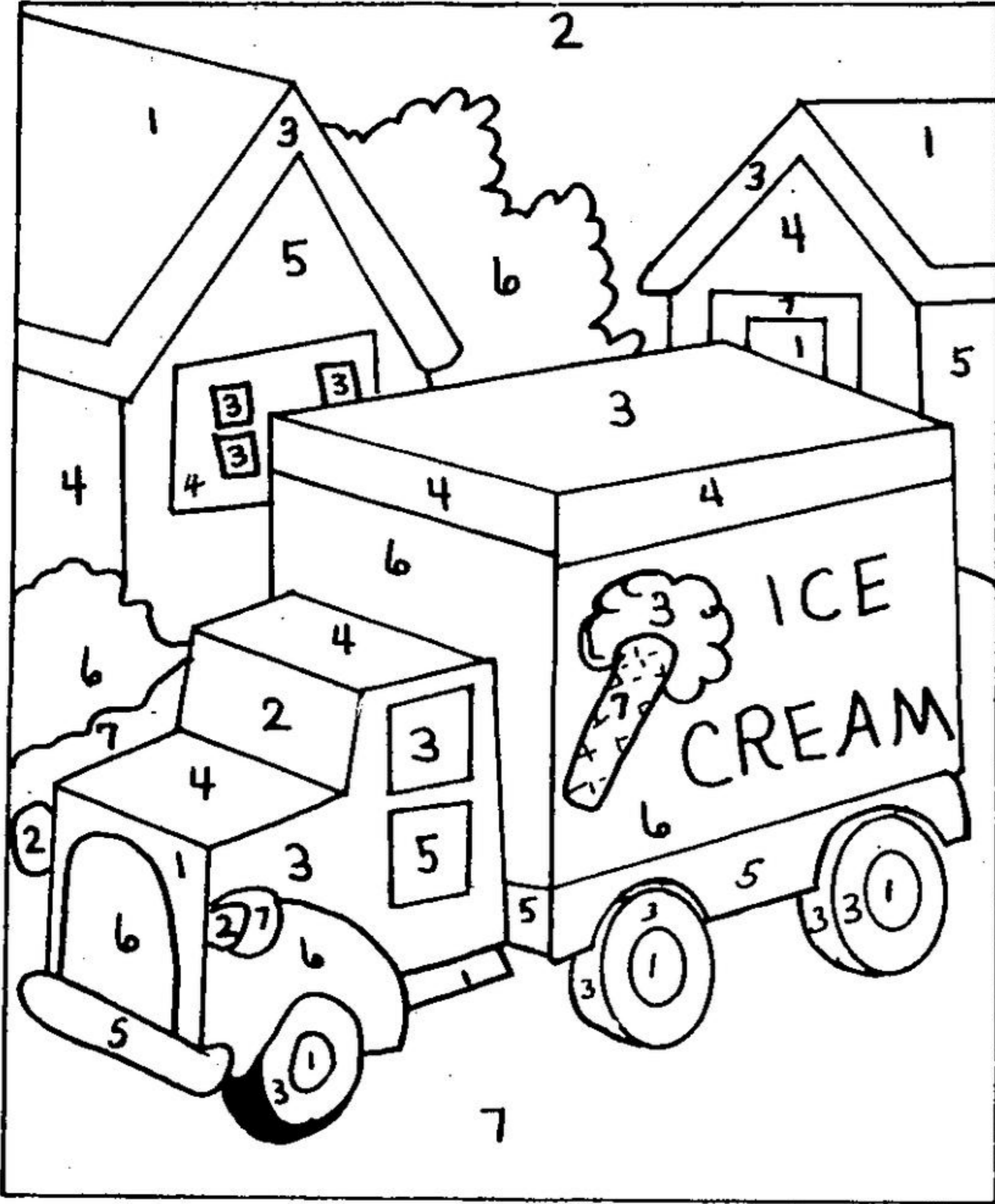


# Young Outlook

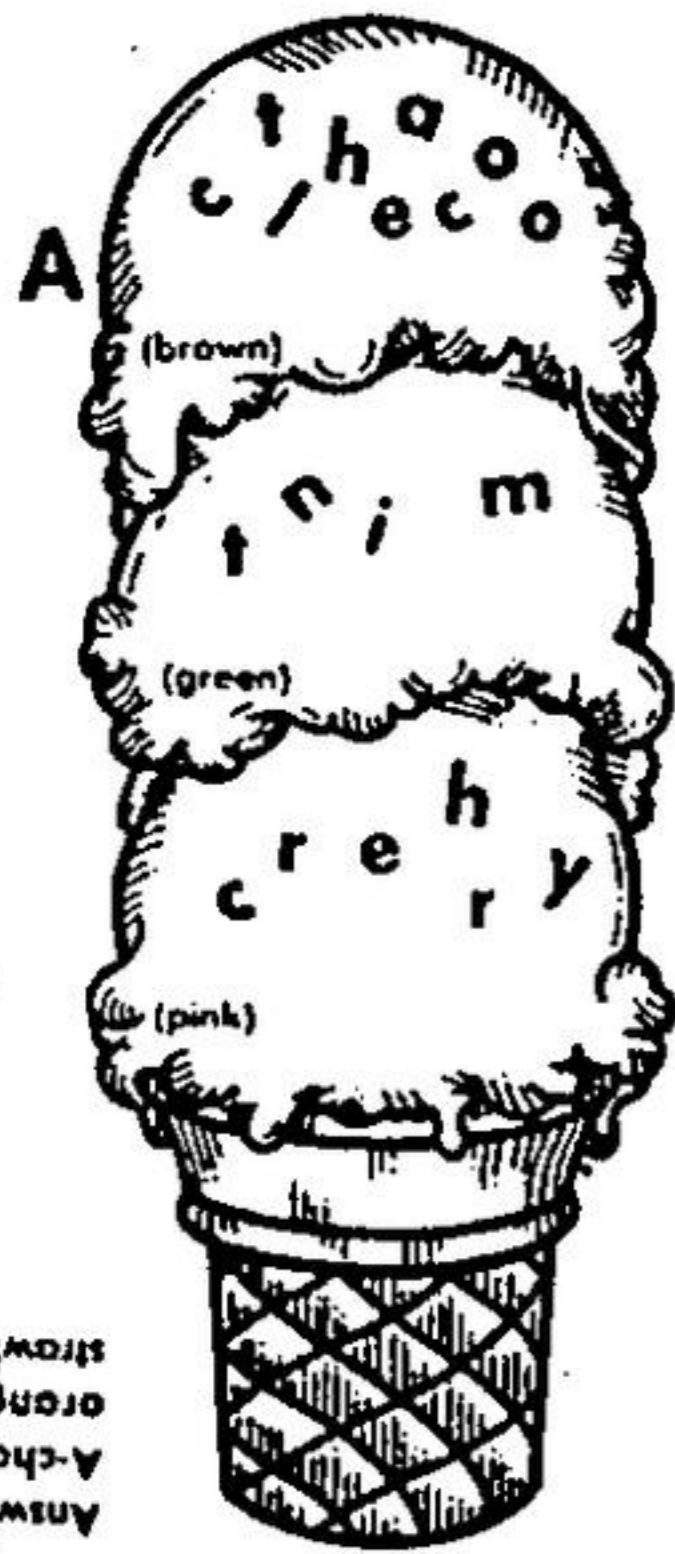
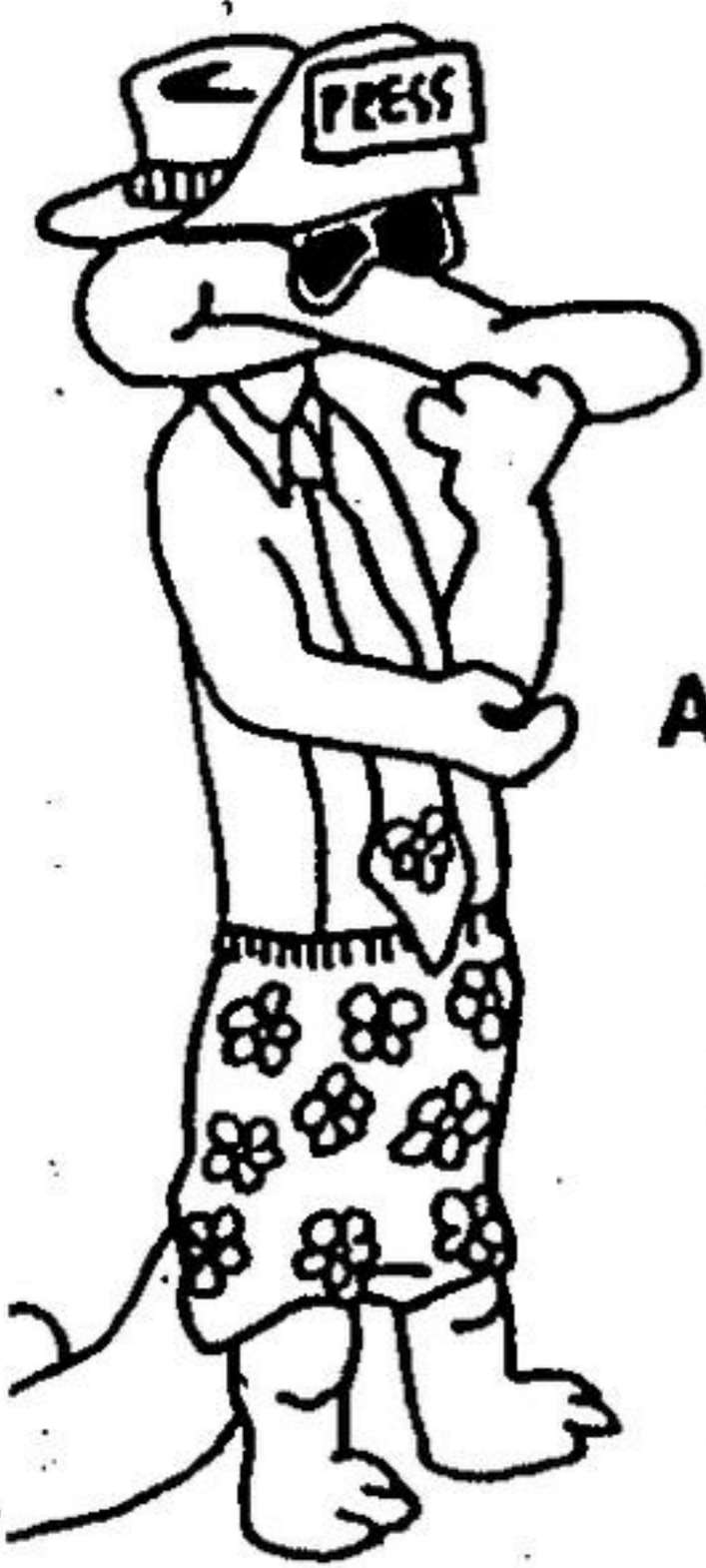
