Regional centre cost increases

Halton Region will spend an extra \$243,738 towards the construction costs of the \$28 million new Halton Regional centre in Oakville, currently under construction.

This amount brings the total of unbudgeted funding for the centre up to approximately \$560,000 or almost 45 per cent of the Regions building contingency fund.

The Region's chief administrative officer, John Fleming, said that most of the change of notices concerning the centre's construction have now been costed into the final budget. "We're not in bad shape," said Mr. Fleming.

Police electrical and computer outlets which are to be part of the centre's new police building are one of the new major unexpected building expenses, according to a Regional report on the progress of the centre's construction.

The number of outlets was underestimated by 132 which will cost the Region an estimated extra \$82,000.

Halton Hills Regional councillor Joe Hewitt, who sits on the

Regional building expansion committee, said he was surprised 132 electrical outlets could cest \$87,000, calling the figure a phenomenal amount.

But the building expansion supervisor, Mike Duffy, said the outlets are not simple electrical receptacles, instead, they are sophisticated computer outlets.

As well, a spokesman for the police department explained the number of outlets still needed reflects the department underestimating the needs of current and future staff.

Regional chairman, Peter Pomeroy, defended the extra costs saying, "there are always surprises during the building process, especially with a public building."

The other additional construction costs include:

administration washroom renovations, \$81,563

administration mechanical exhaust duct, \$53,288 administration planning

library, \$43,500 - hydro duct bank and vaults, \$36,547.
