Mix this with the fact that Meznic also has one of the premier defences in the league, and you know any fan of the GFFL will be there for the opening kickoff.

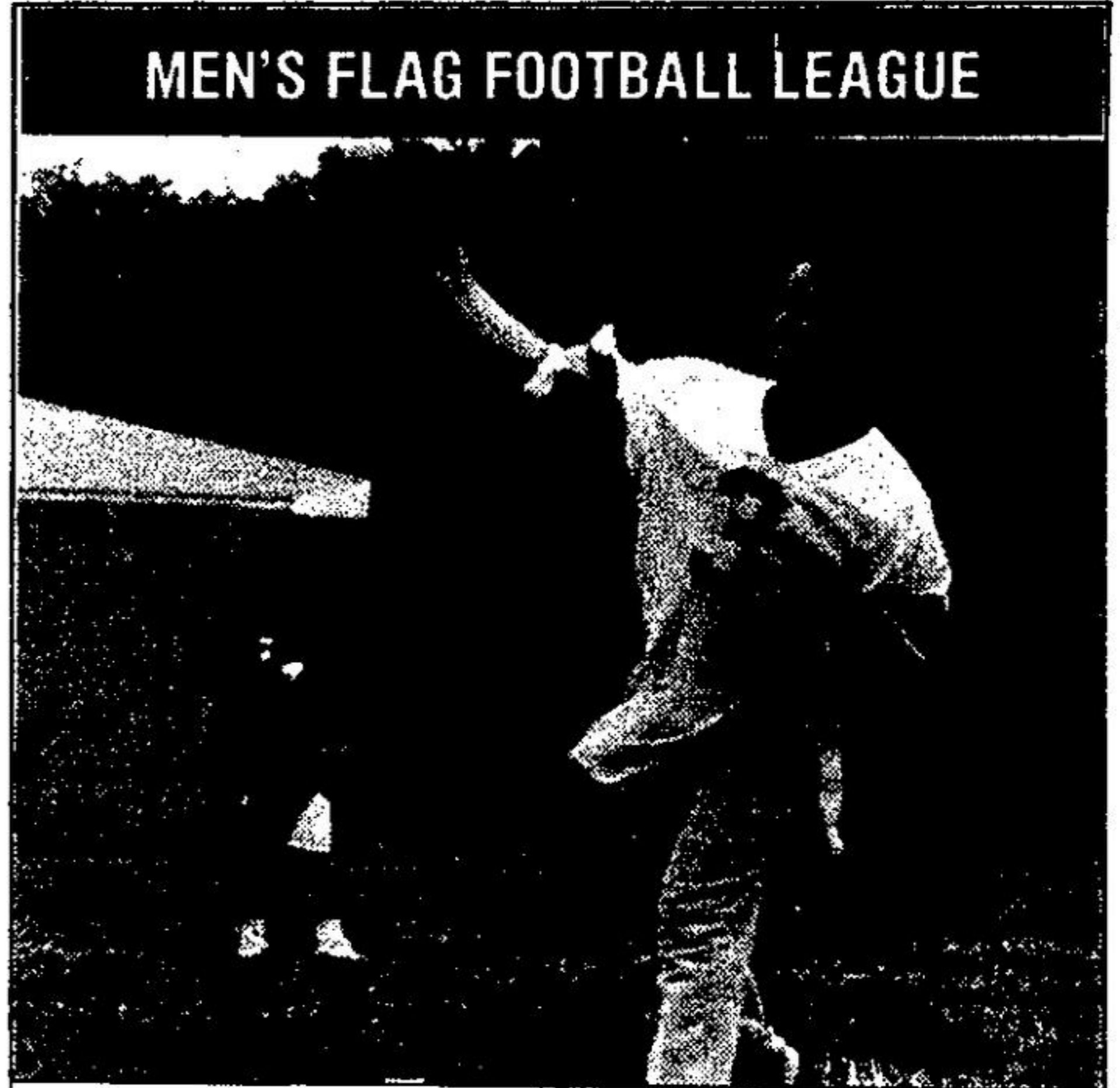
12:30 p.m. - Oldtimers vs. Plus Welding, Welders by 2.

Molson 400 race offers some thunder

Racing fans from the Halton Hills area will soon be able to enjoy some top-notch competition on the track and they won't have to wait too long to do so.

The Molson Export 400 returns to Cayuga Speedway August 4 and 5 featuring NASCAR stars Dale Earnhardt and Dick Trickle. This American Speed Association (ASA) sanctioned event is part of the \$2 million, 17-race AC-Delco Challenge Series.

NASCAR Winston Cup Champion Dale Earnhardt - the richest winner in NASCAR history - has just come off an impressive win at the Miller Genuine Draft 400 in Michigan. After a strong start to the 1990 season, Earnhardt ran into some mechanical problems over the last few races. However, the 'Intimidator' was back to his legendary form last week edging out Bill Elliott in the final laps to take the checkered flag.

Dick Trickle returns to familiar territory and will face some old ASA foes with his scheduled appearance at the five-eighths banked oval of Cayuga Speedway for the Molson Export 400. Trickle has fast become one of the names to beat on the NASCAR circuit but will face intense competition from the likes of five-time ASA champion Mike Eddy, Harold Fair, Ted Musgrave and, of course, the most recent

Molson Export 300 winner - Bob Senneker.

Last year marked the inaugural running of the Molson Export 400, which showcased some spectacular racing. Veteran driver Butch Miller of Coopersville, Michigan overcame a severely damaged car from a number of early collisions to win the race - defeating NASCAR standouts Bill Elliott and Sterling Marlin in the process.

An added feature to the Molson Export 400 weekend is the Player's Ltd./GM Motorsport Series featuring showroom stock Chevrolet IROC-Z Cameros and Pontiac Trans-Am Firebirds. Starting time for this race is noon on Sunday, August 5 with the green flag set to drop for the Molson Export 400 at 1:00 p.m.

Cayuga Speedway is located 30 miles south of Hamilton, off Highway 3 at Nelles Corners, and weekend camping is available. Tickets may be purchased by calling the Speedway Office at (416) 765-5305, or by calling Ticketmaster at (416) 872-1111. Tickets also are available race weekends at the gate. Visa and Mastercard are accepted.

Halton AAA Hurricanes holding hockey tryouts

The Halton "AAA" Minor Hockey Alliance Hurricanes are holding try-outs for the new organization, starting August 18 in Milton.

The association, created to provide a higher level of competition for minor hockey players, includes representatives from Acton, Erin, Flamborough, Georgetown, Hillsburgh, Milton and Orangeville.

Players from those areas will play in a league with Barrie, Burlington, Oakville, Brampton, Chinguacousy and Hamilton.

The try-outs include levels starting at Novice and run up to the Midget and Juvenile age groups. All players trying out for a team must be registered with their local association. Proof of registration for the 1990/91 season must be presented prior to the initial try-out.

The try-out schedule runs from Aug. 18-25, with all levels skating at the Thompson Road Arena in Milton, except for the last day, which has some age groups at the Carlisle Arena.

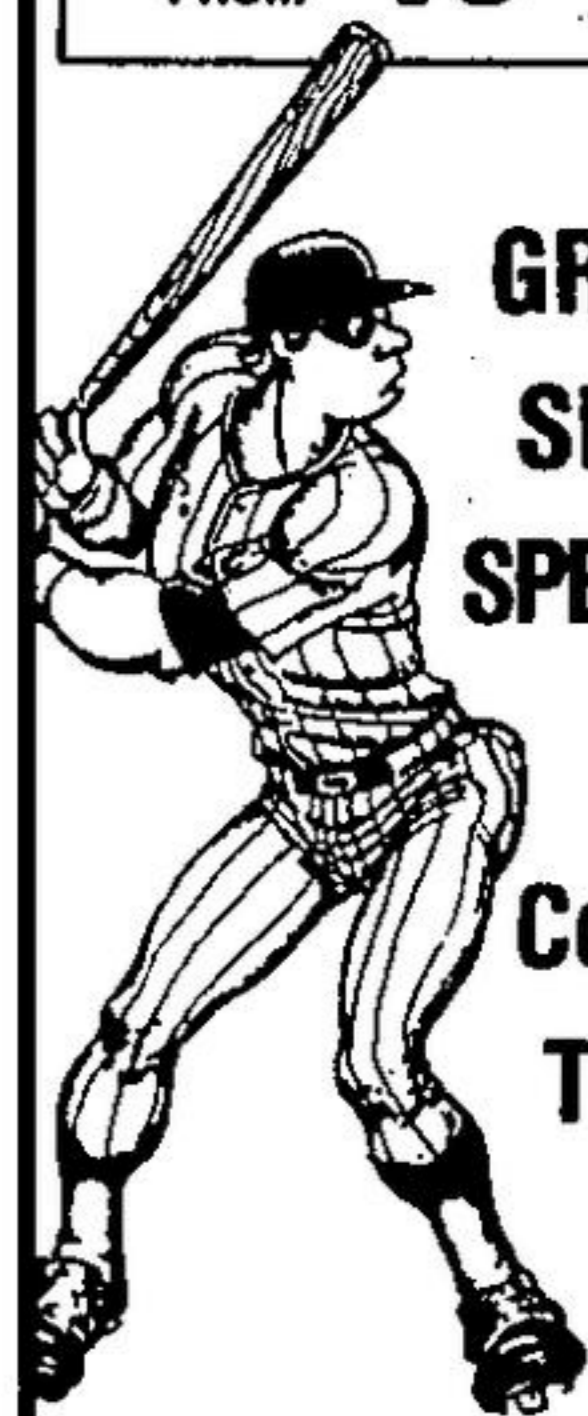
