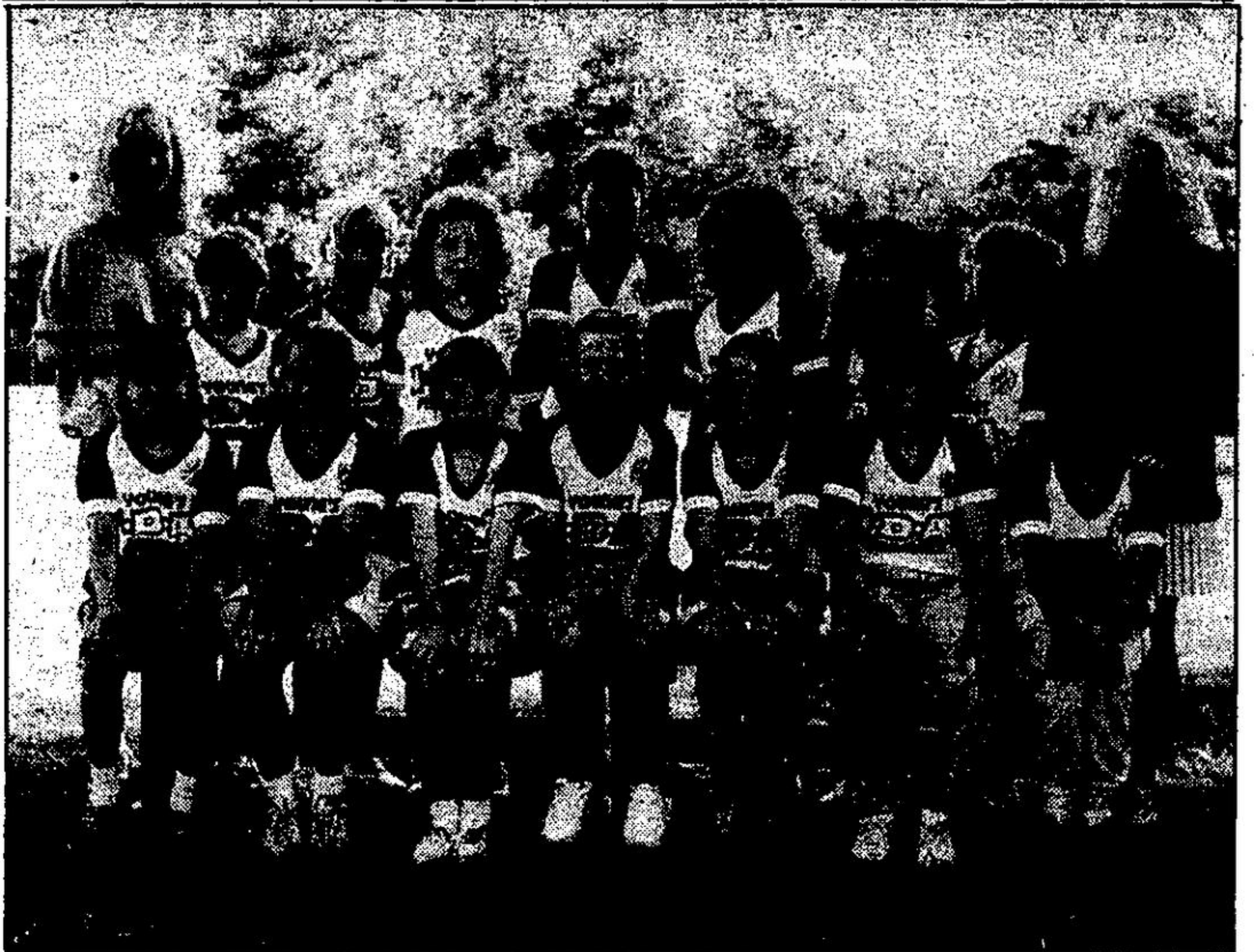
Local athlete Calgary bound

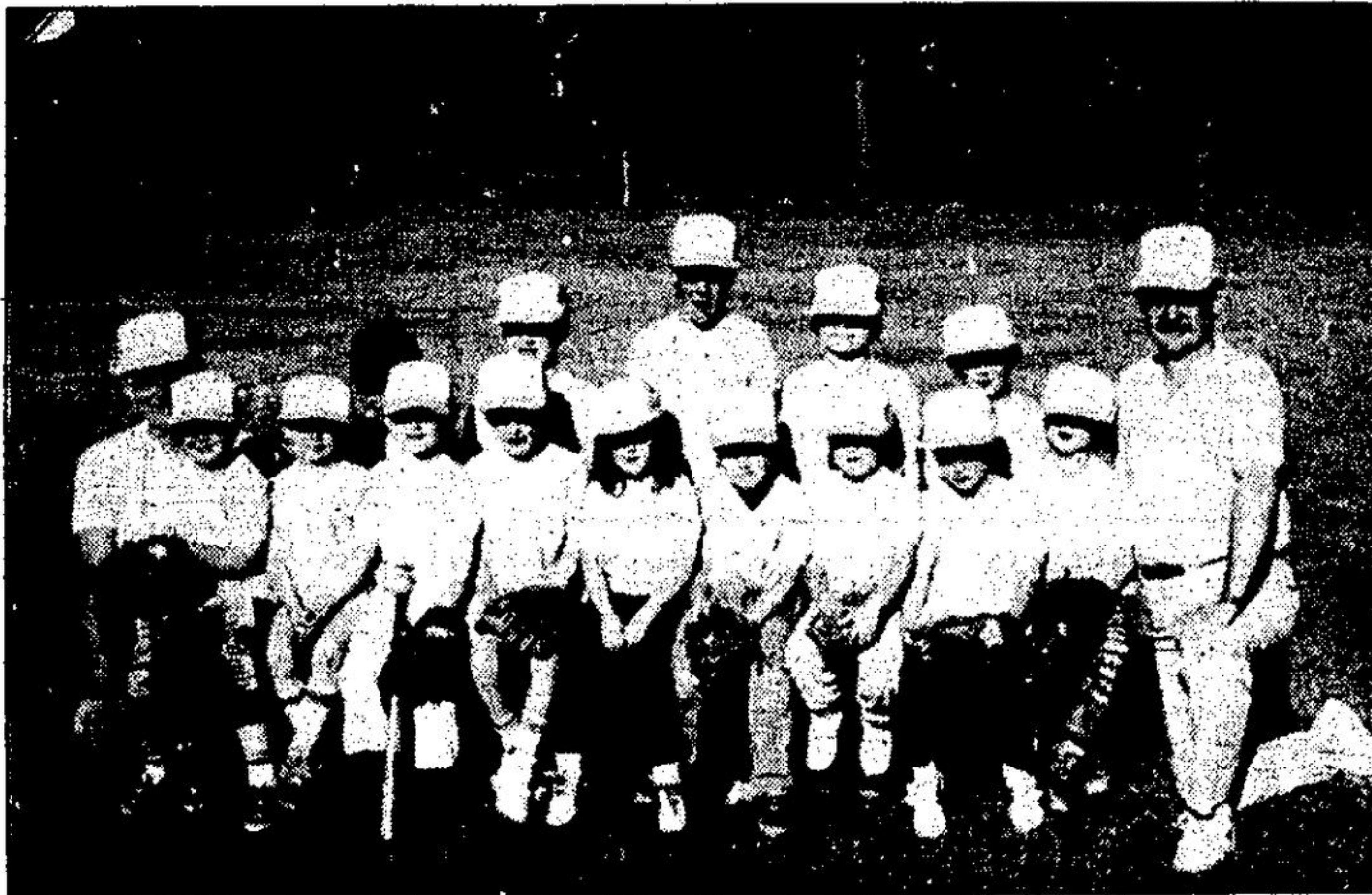
