## Victoria Cross has storied history

This past weekend Branch 120 welcomed visitors, Dot Hall, Walnut Creek, California, American Legion Post 90, Jean Lauzon and Fred McIntyre, Chatham, Ont., Branch 628. Happy Holidays!

DID YOU KNOW:

Only some 20 pounds of bronze remain from the breech knobs of two Russian cannons captured during the last great battle of the Crimean war.

This bronze has been the source of all Victoria Crosses, the highest decoration for acts of heroism by soldiers, sailors and airmen of the commonwealth for more than 126 years. During the Crimean War it was suggested to Queen Victoria that she institute an award worthy of the uniqueness of these deeds and the Victoria Cross was created with the simple two-word inscription "For Valor".

The Victoria Cross cannot be awarded to civilians unless they are serving with the armed forces. The George Cross was created for that purpose.

The first investitute took place on Jun 26, 1857 in Hyde Park, London when Queen Victoria personally pinned the Cross to the tunics of 61 of the 111 Crimean War recipients.

This is one of many ways that close ties may be maintained between the Allied Forces and those of the British Empire that formed a marvelous fighting force in two wars.


