The Halton Hills Trout Farm Major Tykes finished the regular season on Friday night with an

Speedster. Daniel Young got Georgetown started in the first inning when he walked and promptly stole second and third. Daniel then took advantage of a careless throw back to the pitcher and stole home with the home team's first run.

Kevin Humeniski followed up with a walk and a stolen base and Doug "Boomer" Inglis brought him home with a triple.

In the top of the second inning, Young was again a factor as he threw out a Milton runner trying to steal third. He had the ball in Humeniski's glove before the runner had begun his slide.

In the bottom of the inning, Georgetown scored four runs to take a 6-2 lead. RBI's went to Ryan Smith (double), Garrett Norman and Humeniski. Young stole home for the second time in two innings. The home team was shut out for

the next 2 innings and allowed Milton to close to 6-4. In the bottom of the fifth, Andrew Beavan and Isaac Ferguson counted RBI's to give the good guys a lead they wouldn't relinquish.

In the sixth inning, the Trout Farmers added three more runs on a double by Norman and a lot of heads-up base running. Andrew Nelissen grounded out but both Young and Norman raced home on the play. Later Humeniski grounded out, scoring Mike Kelly with run number 11.

Even though Georgetown was ahead by six runs entering the final inning, last Friday's seventh inning collapse was fresh on the player's minds.

It didn't help when the first batter got on base with a single. Mike Kelly, looking as fresh as he did when he started, induced the next batter to ground out, then a base on balls put runners at the corners with only one out. Kelly, who was

as cool as a cucumber, fanned the next hitter with a curve ball the Milton player is still looking for.

With two out, up stepped Milton's clean-up hitter, who in his last at bat had crushed a ball so high up in the trees over the left fielder's head, that it was ruled an automatic home run. With all of the armchair quarterbacks (myself included) calling for a walk, Kelly went right after him and struck him out on four pitches.

Daniel Young's six stolen bases (including home twice), his winning ending throw out of a runner stealing third, and his four assists would give him sole Player of the Game honors any other week. However, that honor was shared this week with Mike Kelly. Mike pitched the entire 6½ innings, allowing just 5 runs and striking out an incredible 14 batters.

The team's next action will be in the All-Ontario Playdowns, which take place in September.

CAN YOU VOTE?

Those persons who on Election Day have attained 18 years of age, are Canadian Citizens, have resided in Ontario for the 6 months preceding Election Day, are eligible to vote if their names are on the NEW LIST of

VOTERS or on CERTIFICATES TO VOTE issued by the Electoral District Returning Officer, or if they are Vouched for in Rural areas on Election Day.

ADDITIONS TO THE NEW LIST OF VOTERS

must be made before
8 p.m. of Wednesday, September 5th
Eligible voters missed during the Enumeration who wish to make sure of their vote must visit their Electoral District Returning Office to obtain a Certificate to Vote.
Monday to Saturday inclusive
10 a.m. to 8 p.m. beginning August 16th
The Phone Number of each Electoral District Returning Officer is available from Directory Assistance when it is requested as Elections Ontario and the Electoral District name.
