Skating Club offers programs designed to improve skills

Whether you're learning to skate, or just want to improve your skills, the Georgetown Figure Skating Club has a program for you!

Our learn-to-skate program is called CANSKATE. Our professional coaches teach the fundamentals of skating, including forward and backward skating, balance, turning and stopping. You'll also learn the four basic edges, and some jumps and spins. The skills of CANSKATE are taught in a progressive sequence and are divided into units.

After you learn the skills of each unit, a badge is awarded. Children are taught in small groups, and are grouped according to both age and ability. Pre-schoolers and beginners must wear helmets, and are grouped together. Older beginners are grouped with pre-intermediate skaters. Hockey skates may be used.

CANSKATE is not just for beginners or non-skaters. The program consists of a group lesson with a professional coach, and the remainder of the time is spent with a professional on-ice activities. You will learn to use the skills being taught. Private lessons are available with our coaches during lesson time, and these arrangements should be made between the parent and coach.

CANSKATE is designed for boys and girls ages 3-12, and will prepare and/or improve skaters. Whether for figure skating, hockey, speed skating, or recreational skating.

After learning the basics of skating in CANSKATE, should you wish to begin figure skating, the CANFIGURESKATE program is for you.

In CANFIGURESKATE, you will start learning the basics of freeskating (jumps, spins and footwork), dancing (following set patterns on ice to music), and figures (the circle and "8" tracings on the

ice. Professional coaches teach small groups of skaters, and skaters are grouped according to ability.

Badges are awarded as skills are mastered, and should you choose, you may enter the CFSA Test stream. Private lessons are available. Arrangements for these are made between you and the coach. Of course, you may continue in CANFIGURESKATE on a recreational level, to learn and have fun.

For the skaters who do wish to try CFSA tests, the remaining programs (Sessions 1 and 2) are next. In these programs, there are no group lessons, so you should have private lessons with a coach. All arrangements are between the parent and coach. You move from CANFIGURESKATE to Session 1 to Session 2 based on qualifications, which are set at the beginning of each skating session.

Precision Skating is a group activity, where everyone performs the same movements on ice, to music. The GFSC currently has three precision teams. Whether you are involved in another area of skating, or wish to skate precision only, come out and try it. It is a lot of fun.

CFSA tests are skating tests (Dance, Freeskate or Figure) which are evaluated by a judge or group of judges. There are Test Days set up by the club for this. When you pass one of these tests, it is recorded with the Canadian Figure Skating Association. The coach and skater will decide when to try each test.
