

Seniors shine in athletics at London Actifest games

The Ontario Senior Games allows seniors from all over Ontario to participate in games for fun, social interaction and competition at local regional and provincial levels.

The first games were held in 1986 at Kitchener and were followed in 1988 in Brampton. This year the provincial competitions, Actifest 90 were held in London on August 7, 8, 9. The games included euchre, cribbage, contract bridge, 5 pin bowling, shuffleboard, tennis, swimming, lawn bowling, horseshoes, 3 km walk (predicted), ladies golf, men's golf, carpet bowling, snooker and a triathlon (swim, walk, and softball throw).


