'Nightfall' entertainment at Georgetown Fall Fair

When darness hits Saturday Sept. 8 in Georgetown, "Nightfall" will be upon you at the Fairgrounds during the Fall Fair.

Nightfall is a local rock band that headlines the "Youth Night." The group played at the Fair last year but people attending this year's concert will be treated to a selection of cover tunes more on the lines of rock 'n roll as opposed to the hard driving material the group played last year, said band member Mike Whaling.

"Because the Fair attracts people from all age groups, we will be playing songs that have the greatest mass appeal," he explained.

The songs, said Mr. Whalings will range from covers of bluesman Stevie Ray Vaughn to Led Zeppelin to Black Rose.

The band members include Mr. Whaling on guitar and lead vocals, Greg Hagan on drums, Dave Haffey on guitar and Mykal Matthews on bass. The band members all do back up vocals, said Mr. Whaling. Except for the bass player the band members are from Georgetown. Mr. Matthew is from Brampton.

The band has been playing for a year together and their claim to fame is a semifinalist placing at last year's Canadian National Ex-

hibition Rising Star Competition. Although the group didn't break-up after the competition it did take an extended break from playing.

The members' immediate goal after the Fair is to break into the Brampton and Toronto club circuit playing original material, said Mr. Whaling. The group is currently writing songs and will be playing one original at the Fair performance entitled "Wanna take it back," he said.

All four plan to have careers in the music industry whether on stage or in the recording studio, he

said.

The set at the Fair will last an hour-and-a-half and the group expects 300 people to attend the concert. The show gets under way at 7 p.m.
