Canada Post issues special literacy stamp

OTTAWA - Canada Post Corporation will present on Septembera stamp bearing Canada's literacy symbol to commemorate 1990 as International Literacy Year. Recognizing that eliminating illiteracy is essential to the development and well-being of people and nations around the globe, the United Nations General Assembly has designated 1990 as International Literacy Year, under the direction of UNESCO.

The stamps will be available on September 7 and, owing to the national profile of this cause, the First Day Cover will feature an Ottawa cancellation.

The event will be celebrated simultaneously in 13 centres across Canada to focus on the unity of action in the important fight against illiteracy. Stamp presentations will take place in: St. John's,

Charlottetown, Halifax, Newcastle, Quebec City, Montreal, Toronto, Winnipeg, Regina, Edmonton, Vancouver, Yellowknife and Whitehorse.

Canada Post Corporation is issuing the stamp to increase public awareness and understanding and to promote national and international action to combat illiteracy. Public awareness today is the key to a literate society tomorrow. The Corporation is supporting many literacy programs under the slogan - "Helping Canadians read and write." For every stamp sold, a one-cent donation will be made by Canada Post Corporation to Canadian literacy organizations.

The stamp design has been adopted by major Canadian literacy organizations as the symbol or literacy in Canada. It has been reproduced as 500 limited edi-



tion, numbered lithographs which have been donated to literacy organizations to be sold or auctioned off to raise funds for literacy.

To symbolize the freedom that literacy brings, Toronto graphic artist Debbie Adams created for the stamp design a stylized bird made up of symbols, numerals, and letters from numerous alphabets: Chinese, Arabic, Hebrew, Greek, Hieroglypics, Phoenician and Latin, in three typefaces. Also included are numbers, musical notations, as monetary as mathematical symbols. In addition, the phrase "Literacy - a human right" appears in English and French.

A total of 15 million of these commemorative stamps have been printed using seven-colour lithography.






