# Ice time is at a premium

People looking for some ice time this year should sign up soon, because the spaces are filling up fast.

Doug Vivian, manager of The Gordon Alcott Memorial Arena, said the schedule is already pretty tight, with 11:00 p.m. being the earliest time available on average.

"Right now we have some times open at 9:00 and 9:30 in the evenings during the week, but after Labor Day, it's around 11:00."

There are many groups who use up large time slots at the arena, including the Figure Skating Club, the Georgetown Raiders Junior 'B' team, other recreational leagues, the house leagues and even the Acton Sabres Junior 'C' team.

"The Sabres are using it for practice, since their arena doesn't get their ice in until after Thanksgiving," said Vivian.

As soon at the Sabres leave, those spaces are filled up with more house league games, leaving the schedule booked fairly solid.

In the "pre-season" before winter really sets in, Vivian said the cost of rentals run \$80 per hour between 4:00 p.m. and midnight.

"After midnight, the price drops by \$10 an hour. During the day is a good time, since it's half price between 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m."

He also pointed out that people who just want to do a little skating can take advantage of the adult noon skate, which is on Tuesdays and Fridays from noon until 1:00 p.m. Cost is just 75¢.

"We also have a parent and tot skate on the same days from 10:00 a.m. to noon on Tuesdays and from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. on Fridays. Cost is 75¢. It's nice for them to be able to come without worrying about getting run down by some of the older kids. Those skates don't start up until October."

Anyone wanting more information or would like to book some ice time can call Alcott Arena at 877-8488. All bookings must be paid in advance.



## **ACTON FIGURE SKATING** CLUB..


