The Bruce Trail is a vital link between parks

Extending the length of the Niagara Escarpment, the Bruce Trail is a vital link between many parks and is an excellent source of physical exercise for those who wish to enjoy the great outdoors.

Built in 1965 and maintained by volunteers, the Bruce Trail is a recreational footpath for pedestrian use only. No horses, motorbikes or mountain bikes are allowed.

The trail is marked by white painted blazes on trees, rocks and posts. Anyone can use the trail as long as they don't abuse it by littering or vandalizing the property the path runs along.

The trail has a variety of sights for both the novice hiker and the accomplished outdoorsman: the fruitlands of the Niagara Peninsula, the beautiful Dundas Valley, the rolling landscape of Halton Hills and the highland of the Blue Mountains are just some examples of what's to see. The footpath begins in the south at Queenston Heights and terminates at the fishing village of Tobermory.
