# Cataract Inn caters to gourmets

Some say you can't take it with you.

Not Rodney Hough, though. Mr. Hough, owner of the Cataract Inn, has figured out a way to take it with you; he's betting a lot of people will agree that a new take-out gourmet delicatessen at the Inn will be a big hit with area residents.

Called the Chefs of Cataract, the new store will be housed in the west wing of the historic inn-cum-dining establishment.

The bread and butter of Mr. Hough's business will continue to be an off-premises catering service and the dining room, but he thinks that a small shop where pastries, pates, cheese plates, breads, and the like are ready and waiting for a busy commuter at the end of the day will fill an important niche in Caledon's food service market.

Mr. Hough even plans to vary the menu in the takeout shop with monthly menu additions.

And, says Mr. Hough, all the food sold out of the Chefs of the Cataract will continue to be of the same gourmet high-quality served

in the restaurant.

"Everything's prepared and packaged here," he said speaking from his office at the Inn.

After growing up in Orangeville and studying at Orangeville District Secondary School, Mr. Hough went to college in Toronto and worked in a variety of jobs in the hospitality and service industry before taking over what was then the Horseshoe Inn in February, 1987.

By July of that year, the catering and dining room business was off the ground.

"The catering business took off right away," says Mr. Hough. The Cataract Inn is in the full-service catering business.

The Inn's staff will book halls, arrange for disc jockeys, photographers, or other staff or simply advise a customer about matters other than the food.

They've prepared a comprehensive banquet-planning booklet to guide the customer through what can be a complex and time-consuming process.

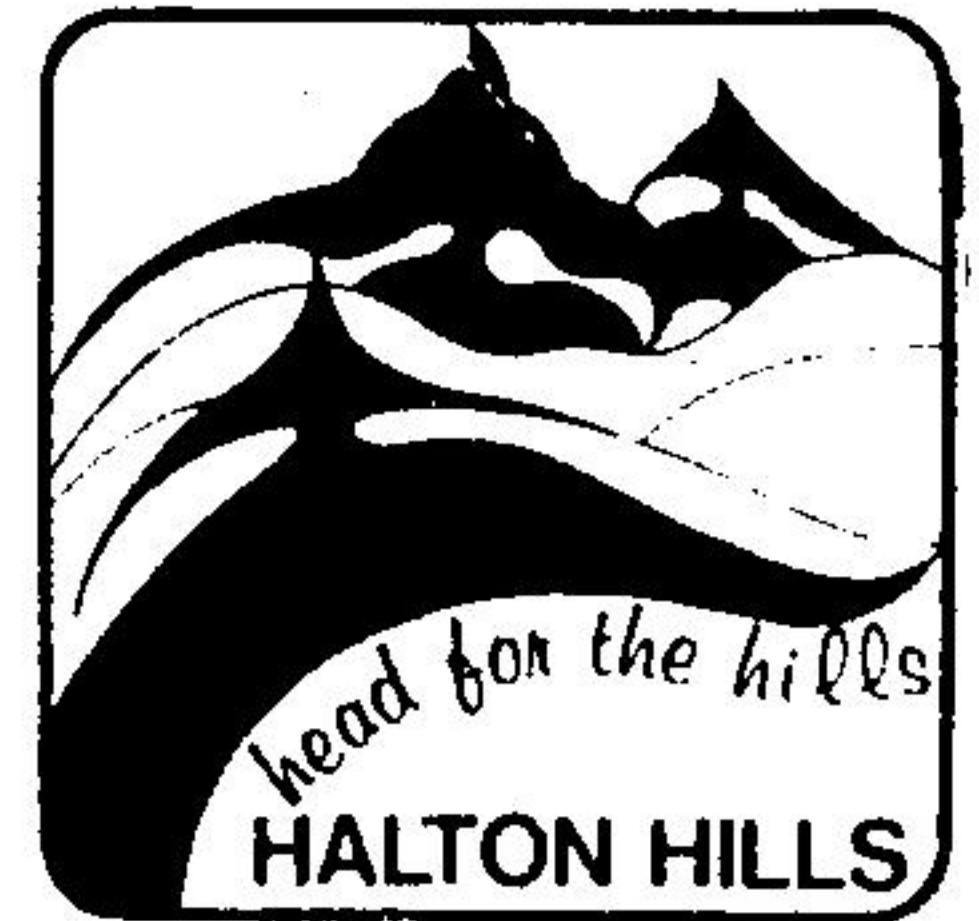
The Inn itself, a kilometre or

two south of Highway 9 and Highway 136, is the headquarters for all of Mr. Hough's businesses.

The Inn is home to small, cozy dining rooms that can seat 60 people. The Inn is open for seven dinners a week and three lunches.

During the day, many business groups use the small, intimate facilities at the Cataract for small "think tank" and seminar sessions.

"Caledon's a very prosperous area. It's a great place to be," says Mr. Hough.

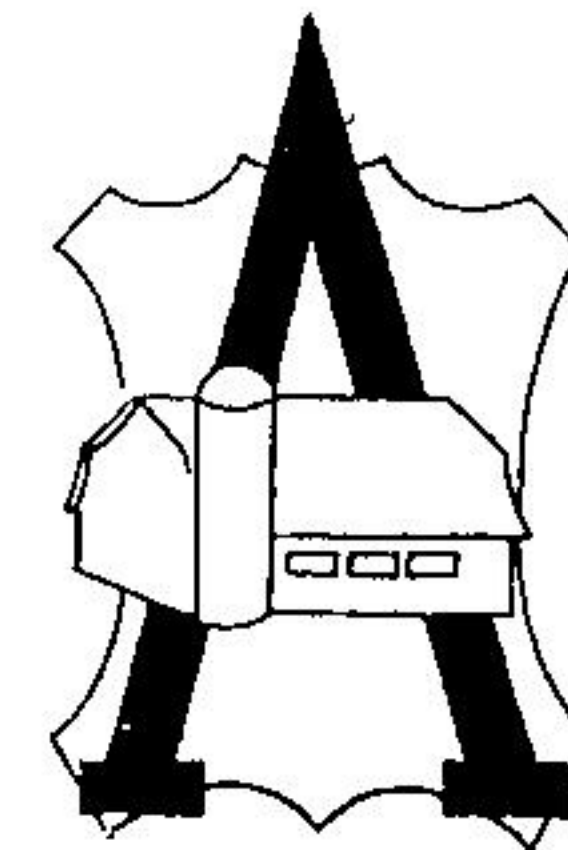
