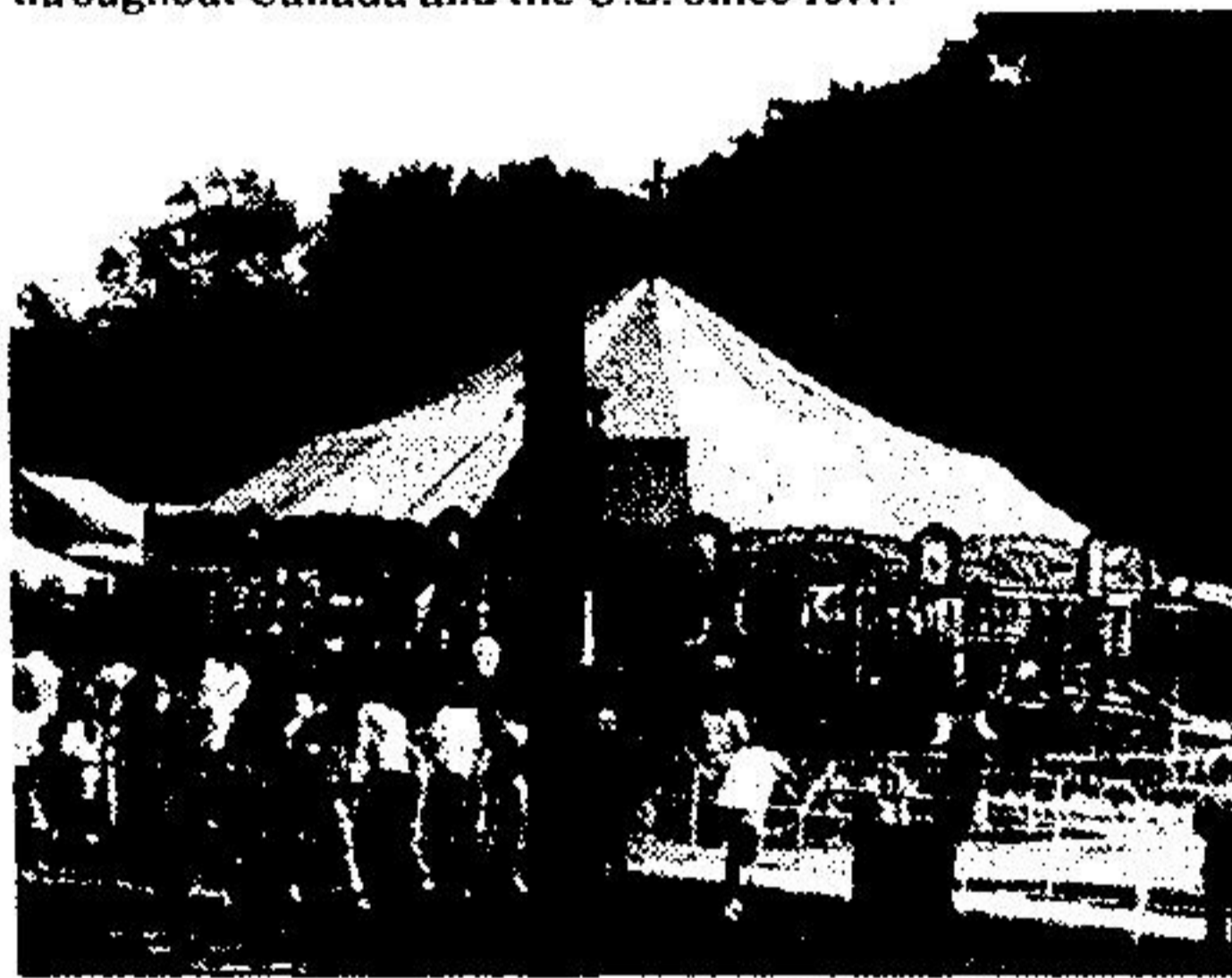
Coming to Old MacDonald's Farm

"Children's Day" events and attractions are scheduled sure to keep the young (and the young at heart) entertained for the whole afternoon. This year's Fair organizers have gone all out to provide the best Children's Day yet, with ongoing entertainment from noon to 5 p.m.

Returning this year at the fair is Dr. Bandoli and his travelling Goodtime Show. It is unique with a high-spirited presentation using improvisational story telling and mime to create fun and laughter to entertain folks of all ages. "It's Unbelievable" and the Lincoln Leapers, the 1988 World Double Dutch Champions. Fairgoers will be able to catch the action of the Lincoln Leapers several times throughout the afternoon on Sunday.

Also returning for the third year is "Sphere Clown Band" with two performances. Band members Bumpy, Patty, Banger and Gizmo have performed throughout Canada and the U.S. since 1977.



Past performances have included 5 seasons at Ontario Place, Roy Thomson Hall, Stratford Festival Theatre and C.B.C. and Global TV. The Troupe does a lot of school shows where they are able to teach values and safety rules within the framework of this unique show.

An added feature for 1990 is a demonstration of Dog Agility which tests the animal's fitness and also the ability of the handler to train and control the animal over a course of jumps and obstacles. There will be demonstrations in the middle ball diamond throughout Sunday.

A big hit at last year's Fair, the Kiddie's Pedal Tractor Pull, will have five classes of contestants in different weight classes. Children entering will be given three chances to get the sled moving from the starting line, keeping the pedal tractor between the pulling lines at all times. Both boys and girls 12 years old and under are eligible to enter.

Ongoing entertainment on Children's Day features many of Georgetown's own young people performing in the Halton Hills Gymnastic Demonstrations and Cheri Lindsays Jazz School.

Kid's - do you have a pet that is ageing well, has a moustache, wears glasses and looks like Karl Molden? If so, then you could be the winner of the Pet most resembling the Fair President at this year's Pet Show. There are several categories open for both dogs and cats - see you at the show!

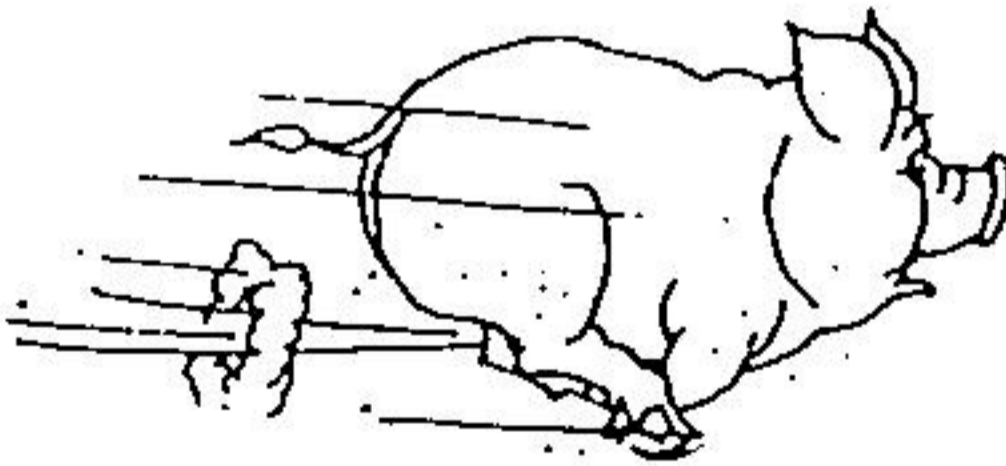
KIDDIES' PEDAL TRACTOR PULL

Sunday, September 9, 1990

— RULES AND REGULATIONS —

1. The contestant must be able to pedal the tractor without assistance.
2. Pedal tractors will be furnished for all participants.
3. All contestants must wear shoes.
4. All contestants will be given three (3) chances to get the sled moving from the starting line.
5. The pulling tractor must stay between the lines of pulling lane at all times.
6. If the tractor leaves the pulling lane, the distance will be measured from the starting line to the point where the tractor crossed the boundary.
7. In case of a tie there will be a pull off to determine the winner.
8. There will be five (5) classes of contestants, they are:
9. Both boys and girls are eligible to enter, age limit twelve (12) years, not exceeding ninety (90) pounds.
10. The Judge's decision will be final for all pulls.
11. All contestants must be present by the time of pedal pull with signed permission slip in hand. The required signature of parent or guardian releases the Georgetown Agricultural Society from any financial responsibility due to accident.
12. Registration for the tractor pull will be one hour (12:30 p.m.) before pull time.
13. Participation limited, first come first served. **CHILD MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY AN ADULT OR GUARDIAN AT TIME OF REGISTRATION AND PARTICIPATION.**
