

Impaired driving

Halton Regional police have charge a 21-year-old Georgetown man with impaired driving and consuming alcohol more than the legal amount after a Peel Regional police officer alerted local police. The Peel officer. while off duty, observed a vehicle driving erratically Friday night about 10:30 p.m. on Shelley Street. She stopped and held the driver until Halton uniformed officers arrived. The man is scheduled to appear in Milton Provincial Court on Oct. 15.

Becker's break-in

Approximately \$4,900 in cash and cigarettes were stolen from the Becker's store on Delrex Boulevard between 1 a.m. and 5 a.m. on Sept. 8. Police sayculprits threw a rock through a store window, climbed through and removed cash and cigarette cartons. An estimated \$1,000 in damages was done to the store. Police are investigating.


Will Ontario improve under the NDP?

At this time, "we'll see how much of the NDP election rhetoric is translated, into policy," he




