## NEC to hold open houses

The Niagara Escarpment Commission (NEC), announced Monday it would hold four open houses starting this Thursday and running through Oct. 4 as part of the twoyear review of the Niagara Escarpment Plan, (NEP).

The open house for Halton North will be held Sept. 24 in Milton at the Hugh Foster Hall, said Richard Murzin, a commission spokesman.

The purpose of the open houses, explained Mr. Murzin, is to gain information from the public on how they think the plan should be updated. Under provincial legislation, the plan must be reviewed five years after being ratified to ensure its contents still maintain

its original goal - "to provide for the maintenance of the Niagara Escarpment and land in its vicinity, substantially as a continuous environment, and to ensure only such development occurs as is compatible with the natural environment," said Mr. Murzin.

The spokesman said that the review will go ahead despite the change in provincial government.

Topics open for discussion during the open houses include such items as how to deal with land severances, mineral resource extraction and the relationship of provincial policy statements on the NEP, said Mr. Murzin.

On the issue of land severances, the commission is considering whether more severances should be allowed for farmers given the farming community's worries that the slow economy is making it difficult for some farmers to make a reasonable living, he explained.

Closer to home, the NEC is faced with the debate over whether or not mineral extraction should be banned along the escarpment, said Mr. Murzin.

With respect to provincial policy statements, as they pertain to the plan, Mr. Murzin explained that sometimes the Niagara Escarpment Commission interprets the plan one way while a provincial ministry interprets it another way. In this instance the commission is sometimes unsure how it should proceed, he said. During the review process, the commission will look at ways of changing the plan to avoid these kinds of problems, explained Mr. Murzin.

Once the open houses are completed and comments are received from various government and nongovernment agencies, regarding the plan, Mr. Murzin said formal public hearings will be scheduled concerning any proposed changes to the plan.

The hearings won't begin until May or June 1991, he predicted.






