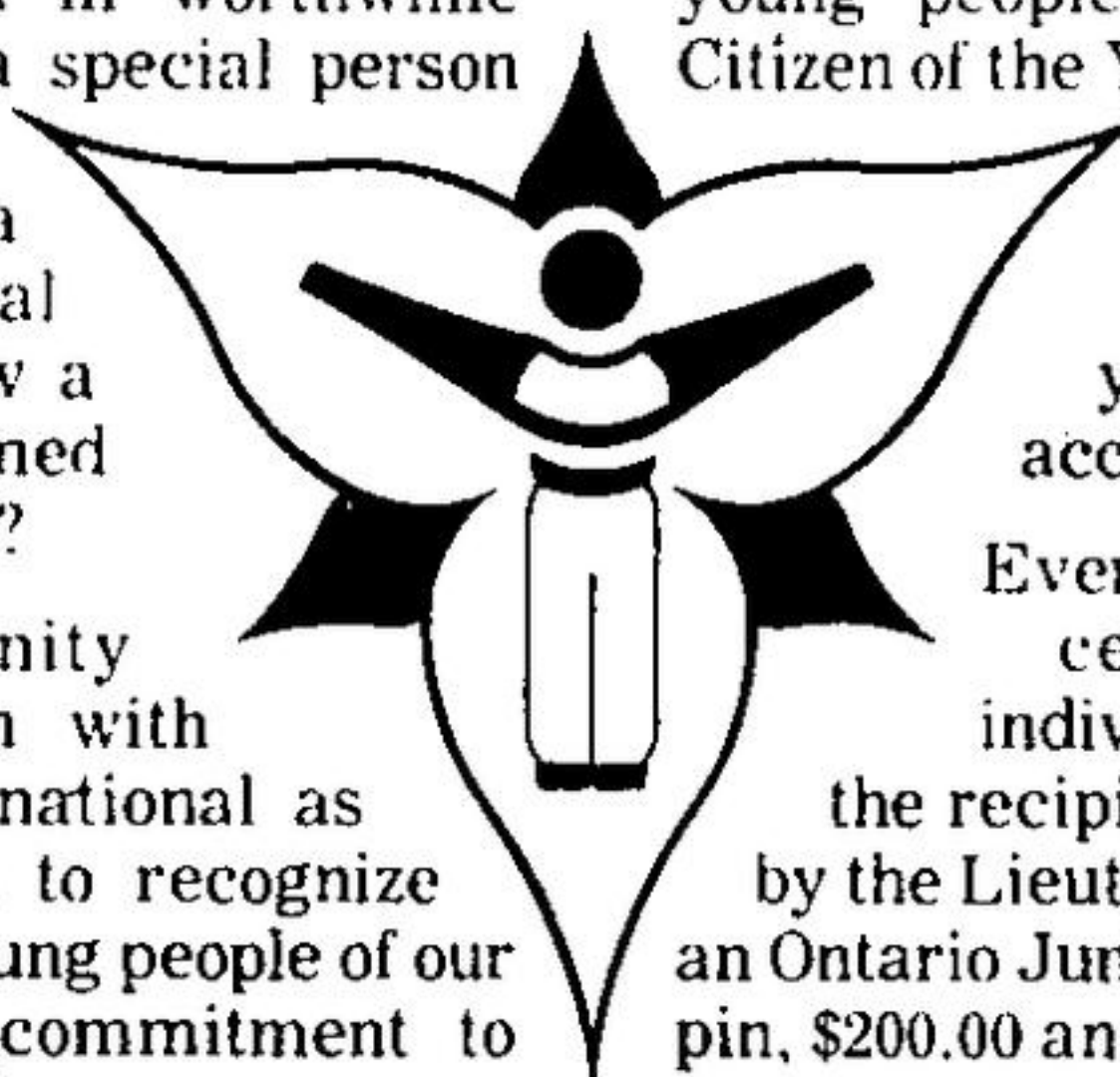
We're looking for
