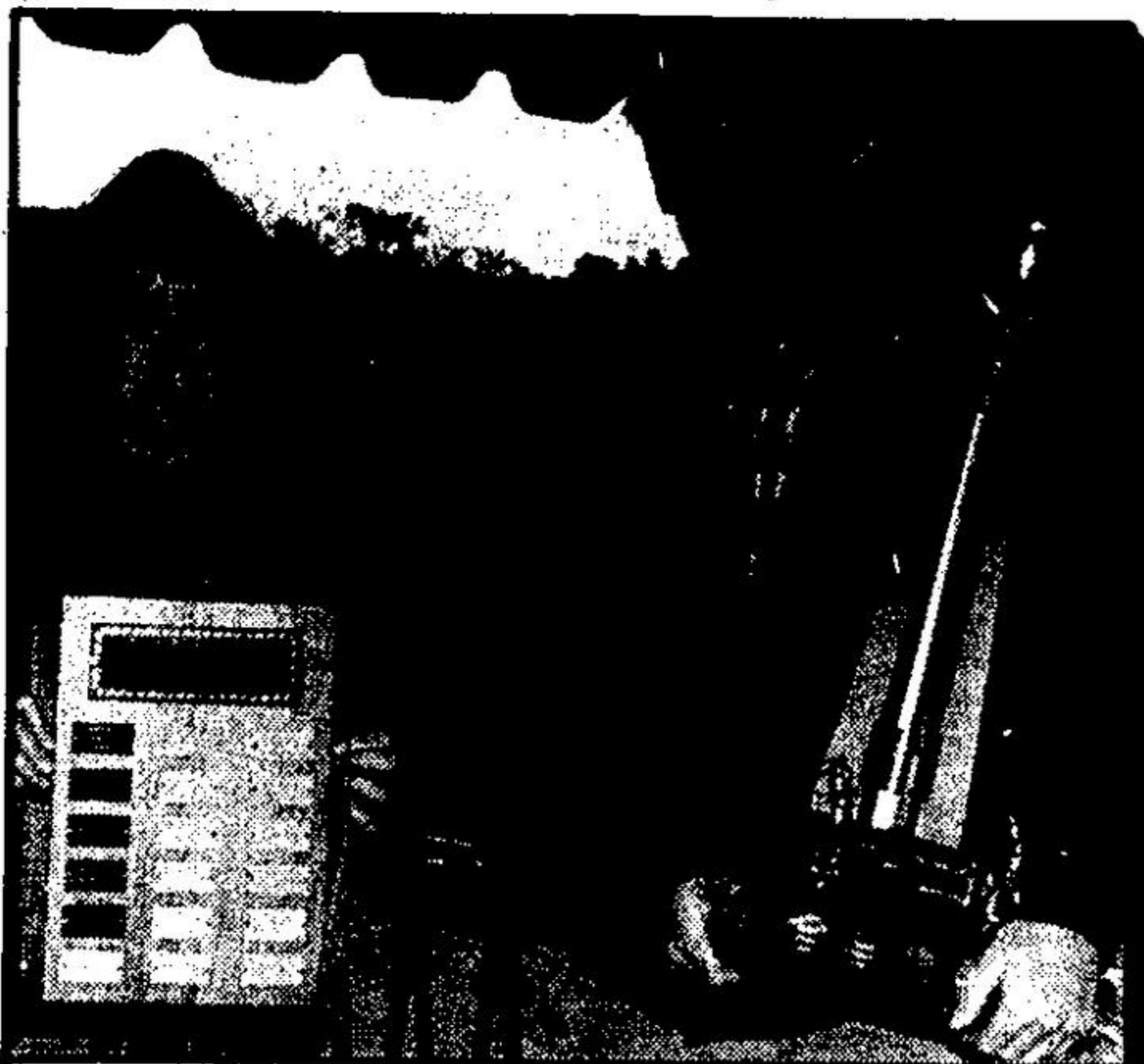

HOME COMPOSTER PURCHASE APPLICATION FORM

The Town of Halton Hills, in conjunction with the Ministry of the Environment Municipal Reduction/Reuse Program, is making 500 Home Composter Units available to the residents of the Town of Halton Hills at a cost of \$25.00 per unit.

Requests will be filled in the order that the applications are received. Applicants will be notified when their home composters are available for pickup. Delivery is anticipated to the Town by mid-October.

Conditions of Purchase. (please read carefully)

2. This Composter Application Form must be accompanied by a cheque or money order, made payable to the Town of Halton Hills, in the amount of \$25.00.
3. Purchasers must be residents of the Town of Halton Hills, living in dwellings in which home composting is feasible.
4. The composter purchased with this order form will be used only at the address shown above. The composters are not intended for resale.
5. Only one composter will be provided per dwelling.
6. Purchasers agree to participate in follow-up studies which will be conducted to evaluate the success of this pilot program.
