Following up on that success, the team came out strong against their nearest rivals in the East Halton division, beating Acton.

The senior volleyball Rebels didn't do so well in their weekend tournament in Guelph, losing to highly ranked Galt Collegiate 15-4, 15-7 in the opening match-up of the playoff round. The seniors didn't let that slow them down against Acton on Tuesday however, beating them 15-7, 15-9 and 15-9 in league play.

The girls junior basketball team played two strong games against Acton on Tuesday at home, with the juniors trouncing their opponents 46-6. With the game hardly through the first period, the Georgetown coaches seemed to have put the word out to go easy, eliminating the full court press and being content to wait to grab the Acton rebound, move the ball around, take a shot and repeat the

The junior football team didn't fare nearly as well as some of the other teams, losing 31-6 to the Milton team Wednesday at the GDHS field.

All the teams will be busy this week, with Georgetown hosting a field hockey tournament on Saturday and then returning to league play at home Monday afternoon to face M. M. Robinson at 3:30 pm.

The basketball teams host Pearson on Tuesday, while the volleyball team returns the compliment by playing at Pearson that day. The junior football team plays St. Thomas Aquinas on Wednesday at GDHS, followed by the basketball senior team against E.C. Drury on Thursday.
