Halton Midgets beat Oakville

The Canada Brick Halton Hurricane AAA Midget Hockey Club opened their season with a convincing 4-1 win over Oakville Saturday at Milton's John Tonnelli Arena.

The Canada Brick team is the senior team in the newly formed Halton Hockey Alliance. Tryouts were open to players from Milton, Georgetown, Flamboro, Hillsburg, Erin, Orangeville and Acton.

The AAA Zone Concept Team now allows players from the smaller centres to compete at the top level of OMHA hockey. The team will compete in the Ontario Central Triple A league.

There are still three openings on the squad, but as coach Charlie Hannan said, "we wanted to go with quality players rather than quantity." Hannan is hopeful to fill the remaining openings with either Jr. B or C cuts or to find them within the above mentioned centres. Home games for the Hurricanes will be played at Milton, Georgetown and Flamboro.

Hannan feels he has "got a good strong club that will be very competitive and the potential on this team is unlimited."

Between the pipes, Georgetown's Peter Downs and Milton's Ryan Peddie will share the duties. On defence, Orangeville's Wade Burrows and Milton's Damien Dubin are paired up. The other pairing is Georgetown's Brad Amato and

Rob Lang. On the forward lines from Milton are Shawn Bourgeois, Mike Cox, Robbie Crowe, Pat Hennenberry, Les Piazza and Todd Mulley, while from Georgetown there are Trevor Elinsky and Sean Guistine.

In the season opener, Downs backstopped the Hurricanes to a 4-1 win, with a very solid effort in goal. Hennenberry opened the scoring with a fine deke after being put in alone on a pass from Crowe.

Crowe made it 2-0 early in the second on an unassisted blast to the top corner. Hennenberry feathered a pass to put Cox in alone midway through the second and Cox's

backhand deke found its mark past a sprawling Oakville netminder.

Oakville managed its lone marker early in the final frame with a powerplay goal. Cox tallied the final Halton goal with a shot on the top shelf assisted by Piazza to make it 4-1.

Canada Brick's next three games are on the road as they travel to Brampton, Barrie and Hamilton before returning to Georgetown's Alcott Arena on Saturday, October 13 for a 5:00 p.m. game with Burlington.

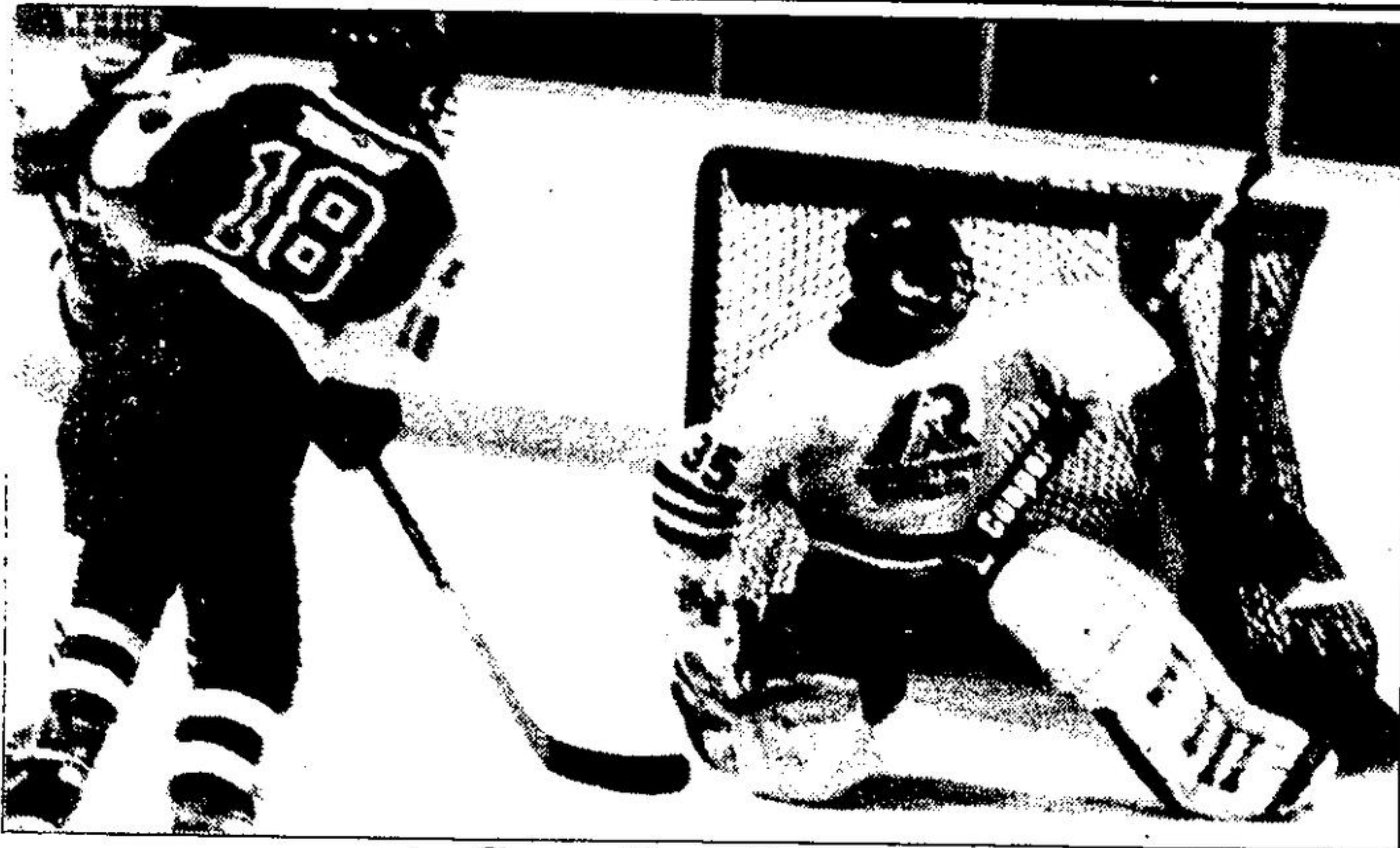

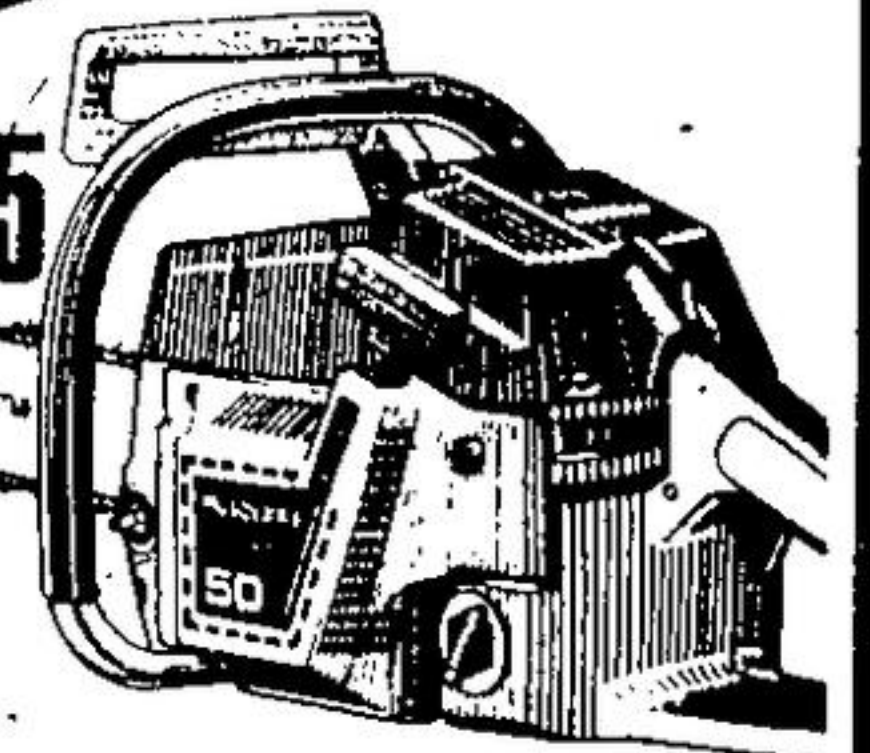
