McKenzie Smith beehive of activity

According to information received from McKenzie Smith Public School in Acton, the school has been a beehive of activity since the 1990-91 scholastic year got underway in early September.

First of all, there is a serious shortage of substitute teachers who are capable of taking over French classes when the assigned teacher is absent. So, under these circumstances, the Ministry of Education can now give approval for suitable candidates, who meet ministry requirements, to supply teach for one year.

McKenzie Smith is inviting parents or any other interested adults, who are competent with the French language interested in substitute teaching, to call Al Zanatta, principal, to arrange for an interview.

The I.G.A. Save-A-Tape program will continue on this year until the end of 1990. The I.G.A. store in Acton will donate one dollar for every \$1,000 of cash register tapes they collect.

PUBLIC INFORMATION SESSION NO. 3
Tuesday, October 23, 1990

The Regional Municipality of Halton is planning the above-mentioned project pursuant to the Environmental Assessment Act.

The purpose of the Silver Creek trunk sewer study is to assess the provision of additional capacity for wastewater flows to accommodate growth within the new Georgetown Urban area. Proposed developments are presently restricted due to capacity restraints in the existing trunk sewer.

The preferred option consists of a second 600 mm diameter sewer parallel to the existing 600 mm diameter trunk sewer in the Silver Creek Valley from Main Street to just east of Mountainview Road.

Various alternatives for expanding servicing capacity were evaluated in 1989 during Phase 2 and 3 of the Class Environmental Assessment planning and design process. Alternative design concepts for twinning the trunk sewer have been evaluated.

The third Public Information Session will be held from 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. Tuesday, October 23, 1990 in the Committee Room of the new Municipal Building of the Town of Halton Hills on Maple Avenue regarding the above-mentioned project, in accordance with the requirements of the Class Environmental Assessment for Municipal Sewage Projects.
