
It's Time To Rhyme

put it into the popcorn box it rhymes with.




Answers: Wake, toke, lake, and make rhyme with cake. Feed, seed, and bead rhyme with need.


Is the planet healthy?



Popcorn Snack

Popcorn is one of Alfie's favorite snacks. He wants to share his favorite popcorn recipe with you. Try Alfie's recipe below to add flavor to your popcorn. Ask an adult to help you.

You will need:

2 quarts of popped popcorn

34 cup grated cheddar cheese

½ cup butter

What to do:

- 1. Spread popcorn in a shallow buttered pan.
- 2. Melt butter.
- 3. Add grated cheese to butter.
- 4. Pour this mixture over the popcorn.
- 5. Bake at 275 degrees for 5 to 8 minutes or until cheese melts.
- 6. Cool and enjoy!
