The game remained tied until midway through the second period when Erin scored two quick goals and looked to be in control. Another goal for Erin and the game most certainly would be out of reach.

Soon after, however, Andrew Beavan took a pass from Cameron Hunter at his own blueline, went around the left defenceman and scored on a quick shot between the pads to narrow the gap to 3-2.

Brad Kouyoumjian, Fraser Brown, Ryan Boudreau, and Cameron Hunter all had ex-

cellent chances to tie the game before the period ended but came up short.

The Georgetown supporters had begun to wonder if their luck had run out, but twelve seconds into the third period the home team scored a big goal to pull all even. Beavan again beat the left defenceman but his hard shot was kicked out by the Erin netminder. The rebound sat in front of the net for a split second and that was long enough for Hunter to bury it in the top right corner.

For the next four minutes, the action was fast and furious as both teams had excellent chances.

With about four minutes left, Beavan intercepted a pass and went in all alone but the Erin netminder made the save and that looked like the best chance, especially after the Georgetown team took a penalty a minute later.

With just over three minutes left, Brad Kouyoumjian took the face off in the centre ice area and the Georgetown supporters were just hoping the boys could kill the penalty and hang on for the tie.

Brad had other ideas. He took the puck right from the faceoff, split the defence and pulled the goalie before scoring his second goal of the game. Georgetown held on for the last three minutes, and for the second straight game, the winning goal was a shorthanded effort.

Kevin Humeniski came in halfway through the game and shut out the visitors, stopping two point blank shots in the final minute.

The next game for the cardiac kids is on Thursday night at 7:30 at Memorial against Orangeville.
