in Halton was available for survey at the time. Each tract was either rocky, or swampy, or both, making them unsuitable for farming but perfect for wildlife and conservation purposes.

The reforestation plan involved the planting of coniferous trees in open areas with annual pruning and thinning to make the best possible specimen. This resulted in the eventual creation of a healthy, fine-looking evergreen forest, however, this was only the beginning for the Agricultural Committee. The evergreen forest would only act as a cover for self-seeded and hand-planted hardwood trees, this served to create a pleasant mix of evergreen and hardwood trees.

Deputy Reeve Art Speight, Chairman of the Agricultural Committee; Reeve Ron Harris and Deputy Reeve Ted Tyler and Gordon Agnew were taking the tour as well. The tour also played host to two representatives from

the Department of Lands and Forests, which managed the tracts of land for Halton Hills; three Halton Federation of Agriculture representatives were also on the tour.

10 Years Ago

The Town Council formed two committees to oversee construction and fund-raising for the new \$1.25 million Arts and Cultural Centre. One of these committees was to monitor the centre's construction progress, and the other committee was in charge of coordinating fund-raising efforts on town council.

A number of former members of the building committee were named to serve on the new bodies. The committee responsible for the construction of the centre was also responsible for reviewing changes made to the centre at up to a \$10,000 cost.

Town council also approved appointments of more members to the fund-raising council for a number of reasons. Sub-committees were also appointed to handle fund-raising from professional and industrial sources. An executive committee was organized to coordinate fund-raising campaigns in town, and to prepare an operating budget for council approval.

5 Years Ago

Glen Williams' local baseball team, the Specters, captured the Intercounty Fastball League championship title by defeating the Acton A's 3-1 at Prospect Park.

The Specters defeated the A's and won the title by taking three of the five games to be played. This win came a full 10 weeks after regular season play. The starting pitcher for Glen Williams lasted a full seven innings and was pulled from the game after holding a 3-0 lead. The A's scored their only run of the game when the relief pitcher for the Specters was called for an illegal pitch, advancing the runners, who were already on second and third when the illegal pitch was thrown.

Glen Williams took the early lead with a solo home run. An infield hit soon afterwards, resulted in a throwing error, bringing home two more runs. The final score was 3-1 in favor of Glen Williams.
