## Health Department offers series for women

Halton Regional Health Department, Preventive Services Division will offer a six-part series "Paus-itive Women" designed to promote healthy decision-making and lifestyle choices by women experiencing mid-life changes. Participants

will enjoy sharing and learning with other women, will explore societal attitudes and existing myths about middle age and find out what is normal. Learn how to lessen the symptoms of menopause, how to deal with life's challenges and stresses and make positive choices.

The "Paus-itive Women" series will be presented as an adjunct to the Halton Regional Women's Health Care Project which is a pilot program designed to promote preventative services and health education for those women 35 years of age and over. This project will include seminars dealing with health care topics of special interest to women to be held at Burlington Public Library. Included also will be cervical screening clinics in each of the three Family Planning Clinics in the Region. Watch for dates and specifics for these.

### Provincial program revised

Drivers who have signed the organ donor portion of their drivers' licences should now contact MORE program of Ontario if they want further information about how they can participate in organ and tissue donation programs. MORE (Multiple Organ Retrieval and Exchange program) can be reached at 984 Bay Street, Suite 303, Toronto, Ontario, M5S 2A5 or by calling the toll-free number 1 800 263-2833.

This is a change from the advice now provided on Ontario licences which directs drivers to write the chief coroners office for such information. MORE has assumed responsibility from the chief coroner for answering public enquiries about the Human Tissues Gift Act.

Cheryl Rosell, MORE executive director, said that when persons record their willingness to donate organs or tissue they should be sure to keep the signed donor cards in wallets or purses with other personal identification. "The card should not be sent to MORE," she said.

Ms. Rosell also urged those who sign cards to discuss their wishes openly with other family members.

"While the signed cards are very valuable in indicating a patient's wish to be considered as an organ donor," she said "Hospitals will not retrieve organs over the objections of next of kin."

As of the end of September, there were more than 550 people in the province waiting for transplants.

MORE is a non-profit organization funded by the Ministry of Health to provide professional and public education programs and materials on organ and tissue donation and transplantation. MORE also manages the provincial computer system which allocates organs that have been donated.

## Narcotics bust

The driver and sole occupant of a vehicle pulled over on October 26 at the Flamborough/Halton townline was charged with possession of a narcotic for the purpose of trafficking and possession of a narcotic. He was found to have "about four and a half pounds" of hashish and a small quantity of marijuana in his possession at the time.

The arrest was the result of an ongoing investigation by Hamilton-Wentworth and Halton Regional Police Force Drug and Morality Bureau.

"It was probably unlikely that it was a random stop," said Halton Regional Police Public Relations Officer Carey Smith, who had no other information about the charge.

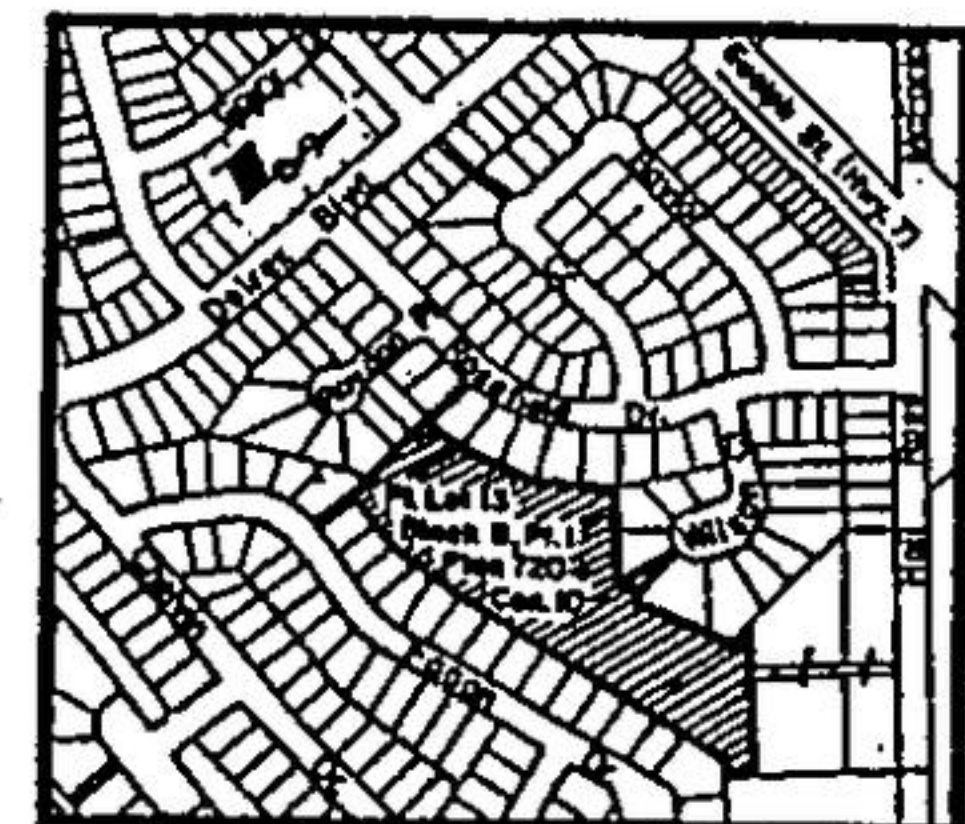

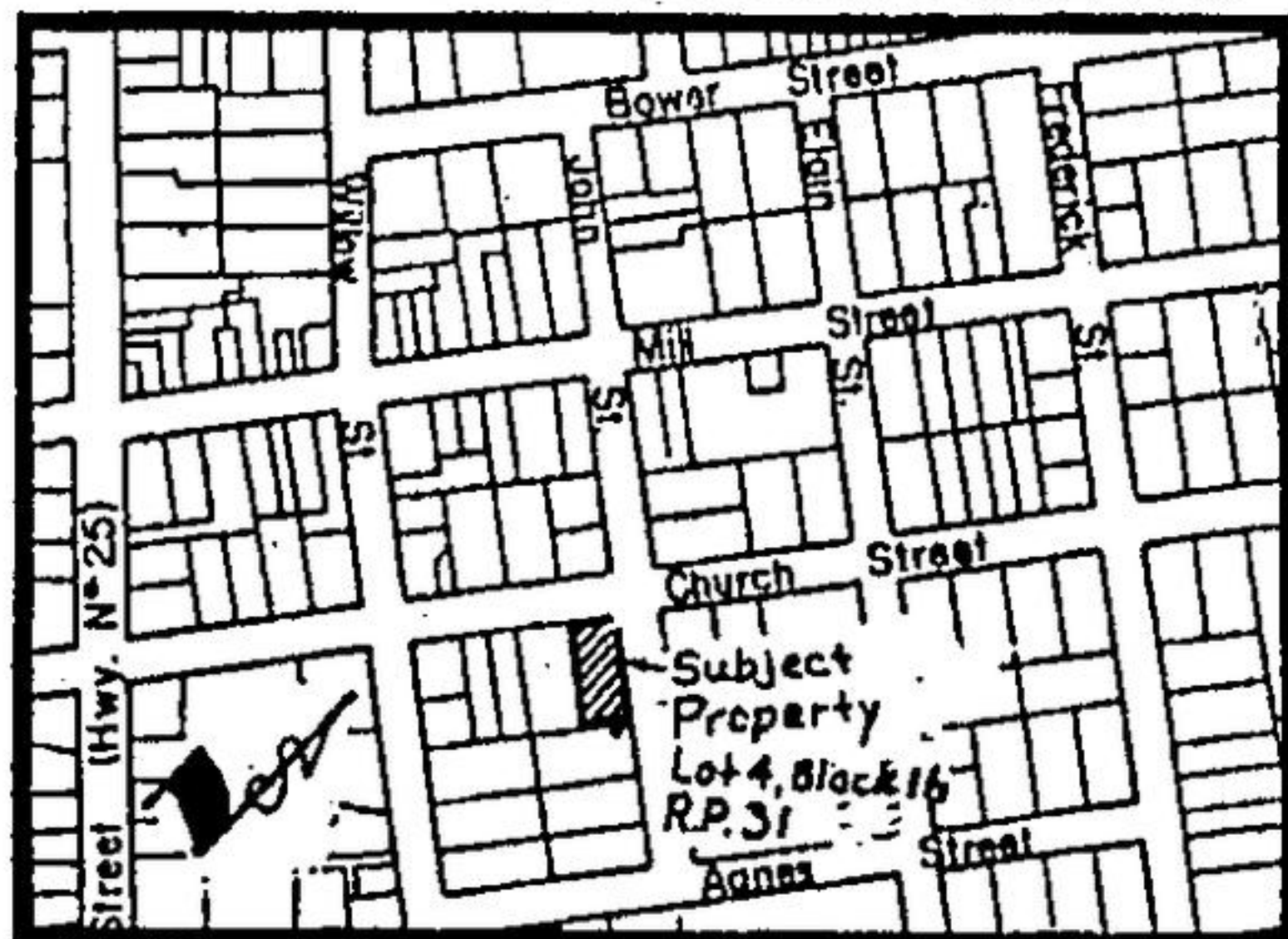
