Norval W.I. holds monthly meeting

Norval W.I. met at the home of Marie Murray, Nov. 1 at 7:30 p.m. with President Jean May in the chair.

Plans were finalized for the Norval W.I.'s part in Halton District Night being held Wednesday (tonight), 7:30 p.m. in Brookville Hall and featuring "Fashions and Accessories."

The roll call "Bring something imported and tell why, when and how you got it" was answered by 15 members and two guests.

A booth at the Royal Winter Fair "Trees and the Environment" will be manned by two members this Friday night.

Norine Van Leeuwen reported on the Guelph Area Convention held at Atwood, Ont. Oct. 25-26. The theme was 'Broaden Your Horizons'. Area President Francina Sebben remarked in her address that change in the next 50 years is inevitable, but the same day, today's problems will have to be solved. Aim high, she said, and when we reach our goals we will have broadened our horizons.

W.I. resolution 'The Living Will' was shelved in the Provincial House at the second reading because of intervention by the Right to Life people. The banquet of speaker Rev. Roger McCombe of Inglewood, urged us to look above the thorns and view the roses.

Federated Women's Institute President Peggy Knapp said in her address that W.I. is at a crossroads. After 93 years of good relations, the Ministry of Agriculture and Food is withdrawing its support of the organization. The organization must not assume, Peggy said. "We have strength, weakness, threats and opportunities." She was certain W.I. could remain visible, viable and vibrant.

The program at this Norval W.I. meeting was International Affairs. Gisela Malchin introduced Nadine McNutty who gave a very informative presentation with slides and commentary of a trip to Africa where she did volunteer work at a children's centre in Nairobi.

While in Kenya, she studied the Swahili language. Travel was by local buses and living conditions were tense, she said.

Kenya's motto translates to "Pull Together". This country grows tea and coffee. Two game reserve parks Nadine visited were Masai Mara and Amboseli, where she photographed every kind of wild game imaginable.

She spent time with the Masai tribe who wear very colorful costumes and she visited the El Malo tribe who live in unique straw huts by the Jade Sea.

The Norval W.I. salutes this young Norval resident for her courage and tenacity in this and other adventurous expeditions. Lilo Dahnert presented her with miniature carnations.

Dec. 4 is the scheduled date for the Christmas meeting at the home of Jean May at 7:30 p.m.

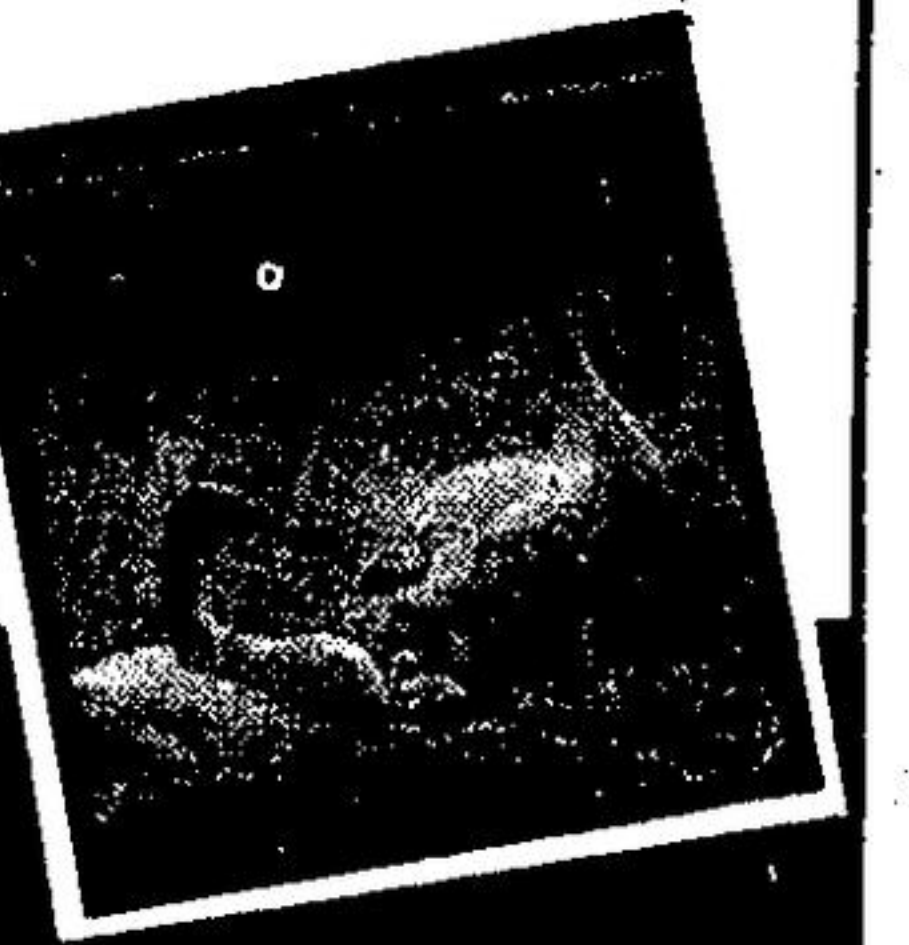


'Frosty The Snowman'

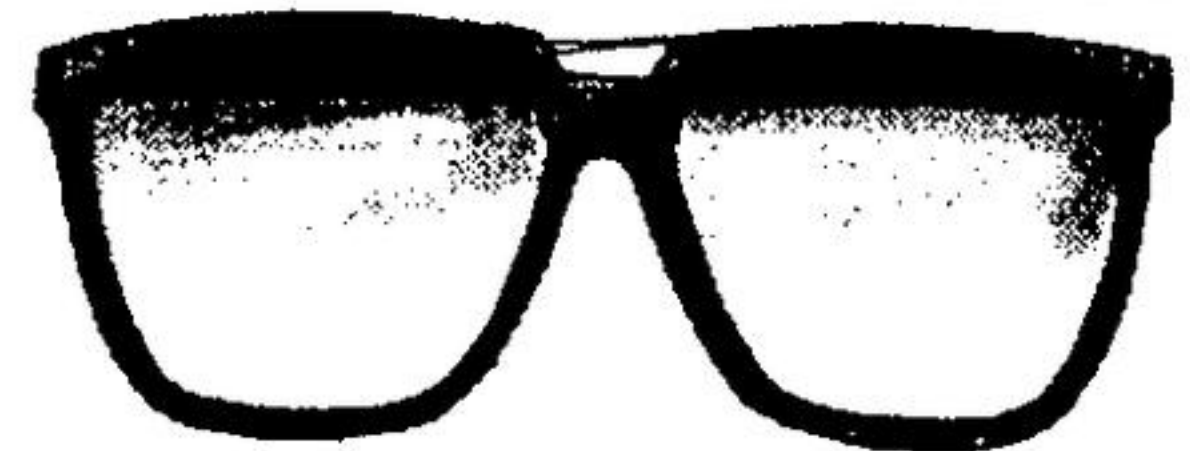
