
No longer do kids hike to the Glen or Stewarttown or Norval to play hockey on the Credit or village ponds.



# NDP to battle GST

THUNDER BAY - The Minister of Revenue, the Honourable Shelley Wark-Martyn assured Ontario consumers recently that, if a new federal Goods and Services Tax (GST) is implemented as presently scheduled for January 1, 1991, they will not have to pay provincial sales tax on top of the federal GST.

This message follows last week's statement by the Treasurer, the Honourable Floyd Laughren, and fulfills the commitment made earlier by Premier Bob Rae's new government. Specifically, it reverses the decision of the previous government to "piggy-back" Ontario Retail Sales Tax (RST) on the GST, as announced in the April, 1990 Budget

"It's no secret that this government is strongly opposed to the federal GST," said Wark- Martyn. "We believe it is unfair, horrendously complex, and will further worsen the economic situation. We are also well aware of the uncertainty and complexity people face in dealing with the new federal GST, and we certainly don't wish to add to the confusion."

"Consequently, I shall be introducing legislation in the next session of the Legislature to ensure that GST will not be automatically included in the RST base as required by existing legislation. In the meantime, my ministry will undertake a comprehensive communications strategy to immediately inform vendors and consumers of this change in policy, and to deal with their questions."

First, a special notice will be included with the monthly tax return cards which will be routinely mailed to about 300,000 RST vendors in late October. This notice will provide instructions and a toll-free number for further information Second, a more detailed bulletin will be mailed in November to all vendors, and generally to tax accountants, lawyers and business organiza-

Third, to reinforce these actions, advertisements will be placed in all Ontario English and French daily, weekly and ethnic
