

Minor Peewees lose again to big Burlington team

On Nov. 3, the Halton Minor Peewees travelled to Burlington's Mainway Arena for their first rematch of the season.

The Hurricanes were out to solve the Burlington defence which had shut them out at Memorial in October.

Halton did manage to avert the shut out when Justin Davis scored at 12:33 of the third. Unfortunately, this was not nearly enough to overcome a prolific Burlington offence.

Turnovers proved the Hurricanes undoing in this game, and turnovers were the main subject of an intense practice the following day.

On Nov. 6, Halton played host to Barrie at Georgetown Memorial, but lost again 5-3.

This was the first meeting between these teams and proved to be a real visual challenge for fans and officials as both Barrie and Halton wear double blue.

The defensive drills of Sundays practice paid early dividends with the Hurricanes controlling the play and the boards throughout most of the first period.

At 9:19 of the second, the Hurricanes struck first when Jamie Walker sent Justin Davis in alone and Darin Finlayson jumped the Davis rebound putting it over a sprawled Barrie netminder.

The slim lead did not last long. After a great stop by Jim Leworthy on the Barrie captain, the boys from Lake Simcoe took advantage of confusion in the Halton end and tied the game with 8:06 remaining.

Before the period ended, Todd Miller's unassisted goal along with Doug Janjevich's marker, assisted by Davis and Peter Mashinter put Halton up by two. Six seconds in the third, Barrie scored to draw closer to 3-2.

At this point in the game, the play opened up considerably. With Barrie looking for the equalizer and the Hurricanes for insurance, offence replaced defence. Both squads had goals called back, Barrie due to a whistled down play and Halton for a high stick.

Finally at 4:56 on a power play, Barrie tied the game.

With just 2:37 remaining, Barrie's captain topped off a flawless end to end rush scoring Barrie's fourth goal. Halton pulled their goalie with a minute remaining but this time it did not work out and Barrie were back on the bus with a 5-3 victory.

The Minor Peewees have not played all league teams at least once and are 4-4-2 for their first 10 games. They play next on Nov. 17.

Worth noting: The Hurricanes participated in the Hamilton Tim Horton Tournament on Thanksgiving weekend. A recent article put out by the MTHL listed the results of the tournament:
