A nation's flag symbolizes unity

Flag of Canada

A national flag is a simple, effective way of identifying both individual citizens and the nation as a whole - expressing its collective will and sovereignty.

Did You Know?
Before 1763, rather than a flag, the royal arms represented the king of France in Canada. The British, on the other hand, were accustomed to flying either the Red Ensign or the Union Flag from their forts. This confusion worsened after confederation when the quartered coats of arms of the provinces were placed in the fly of the Red Ensign, giving it a form of popular sanction as Canada's flag. PM Mackenzie King's attempt to adopt a national flag in 1925 and again in 1946 failed, and eventually, in 1964, PM Lester B. Pearson assigned the task of evolving a suitable design to an all-party, 15 member special committee.

After considerable debate, the final design adopted by Parliament, and approved by royal proclamation, became Canada's flag 15 Feb. 1965. Red and white had been sanctioned as national colours by the royal proclamation granting a coat of arms to Canada in 1921, and the maple leaf had enjoyed a long tradition as a symbol of Canada.

1990 PROPERTY ASSESSMENT

The annual Assessment Roll listing the assessed value of each property in your municipality will be delivered to your municipal clerk on December 18, 1990. The amount of property tax (municipal and school) you will pay on your home or business in 1991 is determined by multiplying your assessed value by the mill rate, which is calculated by your municipality. The mill rate is based on the financial needs of your municipality, county or region, and school board.

Notice of Property Valuation

Notices of Property Valuation are mailed to property owners and tenants, prior to the delivery of the Assessment Roll, only if any of the information relating to their property assessment has changed during the past year, such as the assessed value, school support or address; or if they appealed their 1989 property assessment!

Information Open Houses

Whether or not you received a Notice of Property Valuation, you may have questions about your property assessment. If you do, please come to an information Open House. An assessor from the Ministry of Revenue's Regional Assessment Office will be available to explain your assessment, answer your questions, and change any inaccurate information relating to your property.

If you have questions but can't make it to an Open House, please call or visit the Regional Assessment Office.

The date and location of the Open House in your municipality and the address of the Regional Assessment Office are listed below.

Appealing Your Assessment

If you are still dissatisfied with your assessment after going to an Open House or contacting the Regional Assessment Office, you may appeal to the Assessment Review Board. The appeal must be filed within twenty-one days after the delivery of the Assessment Roll.

To file an appeal, please use the form on the back of your Notice of Property Valuation, write a letter, or use a Notice of Appeal form. This form and the address of the Assessment Review Board are available at Open Houses, the Regional Assessment Office, and your municipal office.

The final date for appealing your 1990 assessment is January 8, 1991.
