

to the attention of UNESCO and took great satisfaction on seeing it named a Biosphere Reserve by the United Nations.

The Niagara Escarpment is recognized as one of the world's natural wonders. The escarpment is landform that dates back to 450 million years to a time when the area lay under a shallow warm sea. Now this is known geologically as the Michigan Basin. The outer rim of the saucer is the escarpment edge. In Ontario there are more than 100 sites of geological significance including some of the best exposures of rocks and fossils of the Silurian and Ordovician Period (400-500 million years old) to be found anywhere in the world. Escarpment natural areas contain more than 300 species of birds, 53 species of mammals, 36 species of reptiles and amphibians, 90 fish species, and 100 varieties of 'special interest flora', including 37 types of wild orchids. The escarpment also has 1,000 year old trees discovered by University of Guelph, biologist Dr. Doug Larson.

John founded the Niagara Escarpment Alliance to encourage the preservation of the escarpment in the United States as well as in Ontario. Last summer he took his holiday time to travel to New York, Pennsylvania, Michigan and Wisconsin to promote the alliance. Prof. Meeker of Brock University, John Minns from Glen Wiliams, David Hughes from Caledon and John Alexander's son, Jay, playto carry on with that project.

By his example of persistance in spite of ill health, John Alexander inspires others to work for the protection of what is important. Others must now take up the torch so that the gains that John made will not be lost.

John Alexander supported amendment No. 52 which removes "waste disposal or management" as a permitted utility in the Niagara Escarpment lands. The Niagara Escarpment public hearing for that amendment will begin on December 3rd, 10 a.m. at Halton Hills Civic Center. Naturalists,

Bruce Trail members and all who love the escarpment should support the amendment and attend the hearing.

You can make a difference. John Alexander did.


