

Kirby leads individual standings in darts league

Leading the league in 180s is Mike Pepper of O'Tooles no. 1. Pepper has three. John Brown, Exchange no. 2, Paul Kirby, O'Tooles no. 2, Stan Rhynold, McGibbon no. 1 and Shirley Penfold, O'Tooles no. 3 each have two maximums.

The leading high finish is the 128 of Joyce Marrows, Time Out. The aforementioned Kirby has 126 for the closest challenger. No one has more than one high finish of which there are 18.

Individual stats leader is Kirby with Pepper and Rhynold not far behind. Also in the hunt are Terry Hancock, O'Tooles no. 2, Erwin See, George and Dragon no. 2, Rick Harden, McGibbon no. 1,

Dave Nicholls, O'Tooles no. 2, last year's winner, Ron Scarlett, George and Dragon no. 2 and Mark See also of George no. 2. The top teams seem to have the top players which is just as expected.

Leading the Monday night Halton League are George and Dragon 2, some 24 points in front of O'Tooles no. 2 and 3 with McGibbon no. 1 dropping to fourth spot. McGibbon no. 2 fill the bottom place with both Copper Kettle outfits just above.

Time Out visited McGibbon and dropped 4-10 to no. 1, who were in top form. Ian McDonald shot 180 and finished 110. Stan Rhynold, Gary Rodda, Hank Van Gogh all scored over the 130 mark for McGibbon and Larry Varey, John Colter, Roger Nanderham and Alison Colter replied for the visitors.

McGibbon ladies took to the Glen and lost to Copper Kettle no. 2 by the same score. Three singles to the ladies looked promising. However only one doubles came their way afterwards. The girls were also short of a couple of players and Kettle took full advantage. Linda Nicholson had two extra points

and Dave Sibell one.

No extra points in Kettle no. 1's visit to George no. 1 and a 2-12 loss. It has to be said Kettle only had seven players for this match which put a strain on the lads. Graham Gove and Frank DeSantis were the only winners as George racked up the wins. Bruce Stevens and Dave Pater-son were the points droppers.

Joe Cairns, Ron Scarlett (2), Brian Hicks and self scored highs and Mark See 180 as George no. 2 defeated no. 3 for whom Don Hall shot 140. Pete Conway and Ted Nelson beat off Erwin See and self for the singles wins.

Shirley Penfold shot 180. Bruce Shepard finished 100 and Lloyd Sheppard together with Russ Hillier (2), Hugh and Kim Smid and Paul Kirby scored high as O'Tooles no. 3 took Hollywood by 10-4. Three of the first four singles were won by 'Hoolyrock' and that promise was shortlived in the end.

O'Tooles no. 1 shaved past Exchange no. 2 by 8-6. Mike Pepper closed 106 and Danny and Kavan Drumm, Pepper, Mike Sinnaeve and Dave Dentremint each shot 140. John Brown shot 140 and Darrell Weir 130 for Hollywood. Ex-

change no. 1 did not fare well against the remaining O'Tooles no. 2, losing 3-11. Marcus Noel shot 140 as did Ron Duval and Dave Nicholls (2).

On Wednesday at the Legion, Paul Kirby kept up the week's good darts in winning, with partner Hugh Smid, for Steeprock, the teams doubles tourney. Finalists were Taxmen Cam Lavers and Paul Karolidis. Losing semi-finalists were Panthers' Al Gardner and Paul Kavanagh and Westenders Brian Hicks and Eric Fuller.

In the consolation finals, Independents Jims - Franks and Watson defeated Snowjacks Hustlers' Ron Scarlett and Beau Beaumont. Semi-finalists were Roger Moore and Graham Griffen, Taxmen and Inter County's Ron Corbett and Alex O'Neil. Some good darts were thrown in the competition. 180s were popped by Larry Hunt and Bruce Hope. Kirby shot 145 and closed 104. Smid shot 140 as did Fuller and Beaumont opened 102. There may have been more, there may have been better, such as Kirby's 145, but not recorded.

Darts Ontario held the first tourney leading towards provin-

cial, on Sunday at the Legion in Georgetown. The tourney organizer was impressed with the assistance and enthusiasm of the Legion staff right from the start of the day until the end. It was a long day with more entrants than usual for the first outing of the season. Mixed doubles and singles were the order of the day.

At this time of writing I only have some male singles information. Rick Harden went undefeated in his section and reached the last eight. Also winning his section was Ron Scarlett, in a playoff with Paul Kirby, and qualifying. Kirby, Ian McDonald and self also finished second in our respective sections to gain some points. Several local players entered and many for the first time. Players came from Burlington, Acton, Milton, and Mount Hamilton to take part in a successful day's darts.
