

Rebel swimmers dominate meet

Georgetown District High School Rebels swim team continues to dominate its opponents, winning 29 of 34 races against Oakville Trafalgar at the Georgetown Indoor Pool Wednesday.

Three of the races were unchallenged by Rebels, meaning the team was outraced only twice on the day. The meet was as successful as last week's in which Rebels won all but six of their races.

The Rebels didn't swim in the junior boy's 200 metre relay, the senior boy's 200 metre freestyle or the junior boy's 50 metre breast.

Conversely, Rebels won the junior girl's 200 metre medley

relay, junior girl's 50 metre fly, junior girl's 50 metre backstroke and the junior girl's 200 metre freestyle relay when Oakville didn't swim against them.

Aside from the junior boy's 200 metre medley relay, Rebels swept the relay events, including a close 200 metre senior boy's freestyle race, won by a narrow .54ths of a second.

Rebel girls did very well in this meet, highlighted by Julie Robertson who finished first in both the senior girl's 200 metre freestyle and the junior girl's 50 metre backstroke. Senior girl's swimmer Kristjana Curry placed first in the 500 metre freestyle and first in the 50 metre fly.

For the boy's, Matthew Zuraw

placed first in two events, the 100 metre individual medley and the 50 metre freestyle. Senior swimmer Bruce Jakes also earned two firsts, one in the 100 metre individual medley and the other in the 50 metre fly.

At the Tomac Harvest swim meet, held at the Etobicoke Olympium Nov. 16-18, Alison Duby set a record in the girls 10/11 section, swimming the 50 metre freestyle in 35.05. Duby also placed fourth in the 50 metre backstroke.

Leigh Shillington set the other record at the Olympium, swimming the 200 individual medley for 11/12 year old girls with a time of 3:00.14.

The other three records were set at the Woodbridge Invitational, which was held Nov. 24

and 25. The meet was attended by 270 swimmers.

Club records were set in the girls (11/12) class 800 Free by Tracy Tabuchi, Melissa Watts, girls (13/14) in the 100 individual medley and Sabrina Bassett, girls (13/14) 800 Free.

Other top finishers at the event were Laurie Anne Crocker, second in the 200 Freestyle; Melissa Watts, third in the 50 Freestyle and fourth in the 100 IM; Tracy Tabuchi, fourth in the 50 Fly; and Andrew Terrell, fourth in the 50 Free.

The club is presently taking part in the 11th Annual COBRA Invitational in Brampton, which started Friday and continues until Sunday.
