Another away win, O'Tooles 1 by 11-3 over Hollywood. Kavan Drumm and leader of personal points standings, Mike Pepper, both scored 140. O'Tooles 3 recorded a home 11-3 win over Time Out.

Time Out won two singles and a double for their points. Pete Pickering shot 180 and 140. Support came from Deanna Jackson, 140; Dave Nicholls, 140 and 134 from Ron Duval. John Colter closed 108 and 140s came from Anson Colter, Rick Rintzema and Tony Marrows.
