Illegal opening warrants charges

Three stores in Georgetown and 11 stores in the rest of Halton Region were charged for opening their doors to customers on Dec. 31 under the Provincial Retail Business Holidays Act.

The three offenders in Georgetown included the A and P grocery store, Loblaws, and Shoppers Drug Mart. The managers of the two grocery stores refused to comment on whether or not their stores would open the following Sunday, but the franchise owner of Shoppers Drug Mart, Al Fraser, stated he would continue to open his store

on Sundays in defiance of the Sunday shopping law.
