Blue Fins swimmer sets new club record

Halton Blue Fins Swim Club member Neil Scudder set a new club record at the fourth annual Christmas Classic, hosted by Pickering Swim Club Dec. 14-16.

Scudder, swimming in the 12-13 year-old boys division 200 metre backstroke, set the record with a time of 2:44:99, finishing 11th in the meet.

He also placed 12th in the 50

metre freestyle and competed in the 100 metre breaststroke.

Sabrina Bassett, a competitor in the girl's 12 and 13-year-old division, earned a second place finish in 50 metre freestyle, fourth in 100 metre freestyle, eighth in 100 metre backstroke and completed the 200 metre freestyle.

Goodlet (12 and 13-year-old boys), Laurie-Anne Crocker (10 and 11-year-old girls), and Leigh Shillington (12 and 13-year-old girls) also took part in the meet, which had 600 competitors taking part.

door Pool. Their following meet is the Ontario Short Course Age Group Championships, being held in Etobicoke Feb. 15-17.

Halton Hills Blue Fins Swim Club member Laurie-Anne Crocker earned three first place finishes at the Dorado Little'uns meet Dec. 16.

Crocker, swimming in the 11-12 year-old group, won the 100 metre breast, 200 metre individual medley and 100 metre back, while also finishing fourth in the 100 metre freestyle and sixth in the 50 metre fly.

Teammate Andrew Terrell earned a third place finish in 100 metre freestyle for 11-12 year-old boys. He also placed fourth in 100 metre back, ninth in 50 metre fly and 10th in 200 individual medley.

Christianne Gent, an eight and under swimmer, finished fifth in 50 metre freestyle, sixth in 100 metre freestyle, 50 metre back and 25 metre fly. She also finished eighth in the 50 metre breast and 100 metre individual medley.

Patrick Potosky, another eight and under swimmer, finished sixth in 100 metre individual medley, 50 metre back and 100 metre freestyle. He also managed two seventh place finishes in 50 metre freestyle and 25 metre fly.
