Cross country skiing begins

Cross-country skiers in the Metro Region can choose from a variety of trails just next door. The Metropolitan Toronto and Region Conservation Authority offers skiing at three conservation areas and the Kortright Cen-

Albion Hills Conservation Area, on Highway 50, eight kilometres north of Bolton, offers track set beginner, intermediate and expert level trails, with ski rentals, a heated chalet and a ski patrol.

Palgrave Forest and Wildlife Area, two kilometres north of Albion Hills on Highway 50, offers track set intermediate and expert level trails, with a ski patrol on weekends only.

Bruce's Mill Conservation Area, on Stouffville Road, three kilometres east of Highway 404, offers track set beginner and intermediate level trails, ski rentals, a heated chalet, a ski patrol and outdoor skating.

Winter activities take place as conditions allow. Albion Hills, Palgrave and Bruce's Mill are open daily through the winter from 9:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Trail fees are \$6 for adults, \$2 for children, and \$14 for families.

The Kortright Centre is on Pine Valley Drive, south of Maujor Mackenzie Drive, west of Highway 400. It offers beginner and intermediate trails, but the

trails are not groomed. Kortright is open 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. General admission fees for 1991 are adults \$4, seniors and children \$2 and pre-schoolers free.

Other winter activities in the Metro Region include husky dog races at Cold Creek Conservation Area on Concession 11, three kilometres north of King Road, midway between Bolton and Nobleton.

Races are scheduled for Jan. 12. 26 and 27 and Feb. 2, 3, 9 and 24. The starting time is 12 noon. There are a variety of winter activities at Heart Lake Conservation Area in Brampton, which include skating and tobogganing.

Per person general admission fees at Cold Creek and Heart Lake are adults \$2, seniors \$1.50, -children \$1 and pre-schoolers
