## Busy Major Atoms schedule

Star Fuels Major Atoms have been busy of late with five games in ten days, winning two of them. On Dec. 20, league leading Oakville paid their first visit to Georgetown and went away with a hard fought 2-0 win. It was a close game with Georgetown playing as well as they have all season. Goalie Scott Herbert was outstanding.

The following day, the team travelled to Milton for an evening contest. Although they weren't at full speed, Georgetown still managed a 4-0 win with Kevin Humeniski getting the shutout.

Stephen Gibbons opened the scoring near the end of the first period as he fired home a rebound from a shot by Andrew Beavan. With just under two minutes left in the second period, Ryan Boudreau put Georgetown up 2-0 with assists going to Steve Smith and David Papadopoulos.

Before the second period ended, Beavan scored his third goal from Gibbons. Beavan then completed the scoring with two minutes left in the game as he took a pass from Fraser Brown,

split the defence and deked the goalie.

After being moved up from defence to play centre this year, Beavan is thriving under the coaching of John Andrews, and after 18 games he has 17 points.

Two days later Georgetown played a rematch with Oakville in their rink and came out on the short end of a 6-3 score.

Halfway through the first frame, Gibbons converted a pass from Beavan to tie the game at one. Just over four minutes later, Fraser Brown was in deep forechecking when he stole the puck from an Oakville defender. Before the opposition could react, Fraser buried a backhand shot into the top right corner for a 2-1 lead.

This was shortlived however and by the time Allan Rasmussen set up Ryan Boudreau for Georgetown's third goal in the last period, the game was out of reach.

On Dec. 28 Georgetown competed in a one day tournament in Acton. In the opening game against Flamborough, the boys

squeaked out a 3-1 win to advance to the semi-final.

Alan Rasmussen opened the scoring near the end of the second period only to have Flamborough tie the game a minute later. Rick Clark assisted.

With time running out and the game still tied at one, Beavan took the puck down the left side and found Gibbons in the slot. Stephen one timed the pass into the net for the winning goal.

Beavan then iced the victory a minute later with a high shot over the goalie's left shoulder after stealing the puck at the blueline.

Georgetown ran into a powerhouse in the afternoon game as the team from Fergus skated to an 8-0 win. Fergus went on to beat Acton in the final 12-1.
