Their final margin of victory with Ian Mellor calling the game against Shannon Jackson was eight points and seven of eight ends. The scoreboard read 9-1. Shannon's only consolation was a surprise post-game birthday celebration.

Beside this game on Sheet no. 4 was an exciting back and forth contest played between La Guys

and Kendale's other squad, the Hackers. The Hackers had novice curler Sam Moore calling the game against Dan Costea's substitute "La Goddess" Heather Scotland.

The outcome of this game was not decided until last rocks were thrown. Into the eighth end, the Hackers were leading by a single point. The score was 5-4 and they had last shot, having given up a single point in the seventh.

Coming into last rocks, there were two white La Guys stones in the four foot ring. La Goddess brought a guard attempt into the house, a little deeper and wider than planned. But the two points held and a 6-5 win went to La Guys as Sam Moore's takeout try was inside and wrecked out front of the house.

For a different reason, a game of note was played over on Sheet no. 1 at 9:00 p.m. The Boxers captured their first win of the season.

The combination of Rich Eastwood curling at lead, allowing him to more closely counsel his green squad, and Naomi Patterson throwing skip's rocks proved to be successful. They trounced

The Sign Shoppe Sliders, who had their sponsor and first year player Andy Malenfant skipping, by a convincing 11-1 count.

Rounding out the late games was a 9-3 win by JAWS over Loper's Swimmers. Lynn Shillington skipped for JAWS, and under her direction and shot making, JAWS started their match-up with a big four point first end. North Halton's golf pro, John Henderson, was in charge of the Loper's crew, but missing two regulars, he wasn't able to get the Swimmers on track.

In early play when the throng of kids were out to watch their parent(s) play, two games were close affairs. In one, the match-up between Bill Smith Auto Wingnuts and The Senators, the showdown ended in a 8-8 tie. Eldon Eckroth skipped for the Smith rink against the Senator's Murray Henley.

Scoreboard watchers who took their eye off this game early missed a noteworthy Senator's rally. The Wingnuts had jumped out to a 7-1 lead after four ends, a point when Brad Smith excited to get another team member, Rick

Kritschgau, into the game.

Whether the change in chemistry had something to do with the turn of events is open to conjecture, but The Senators won the next three ends, and headed into the last end with a one-point lead 8-7. Eckroth, with the last end hammer, came away with a single in the eighth to eke out the tie (and to preserve his personal undefeated record this season when calling his team's game).

The other early contest which came down to a last rocks' affair was between Challengers and Dunlop Insurance Rockers. The Dunlop team, skipped by their regular lead Bert Osborne, played catch-up throughout the game.

Lois Brisley of the Challengers came up with the clutch shots to keep the Rockers from breaking away, always easing the pressure on Ron Doernback who was skipping his first ever game. The Rockers squeaked by with a 6-4 final due to two good closing shots by Osborne and an outside miss by Doernback.
