"We're getting Bobby Gagnon, who played for us last year on right wing and Keith Kerfoot, a forward from Guelph. Both of them should be playing for us this weekend."

II hockey in Pembroke earlier this year, while Kerfoot comes in from Guelph. Sabres play tonight (Friday) against Grand Valley and Saturday against Alliston, both at home. Sunday's game is in Bradford against the fourth place Bulls.

Steen said the team will keep its present roster intact and is not likely to release any players until the playoff deadline.

Raider president and interim general manager Finn Poulstrup said the team is close to signing at least one player before Thurs-

day's game (yesterday, after press time) against Brampton.

"We're looking at signing a goaltender (not released at press time) who can play Jr. B hockey, there's no question about that. He's a journeyman junior player."

Raiders have also been looking at Streetsville winger Cory Ames, junior player Sean DeAndre, and Metro Toronto juvenile goaltender Robert Taylor, all three who have been invited to next Tuesday's practice.

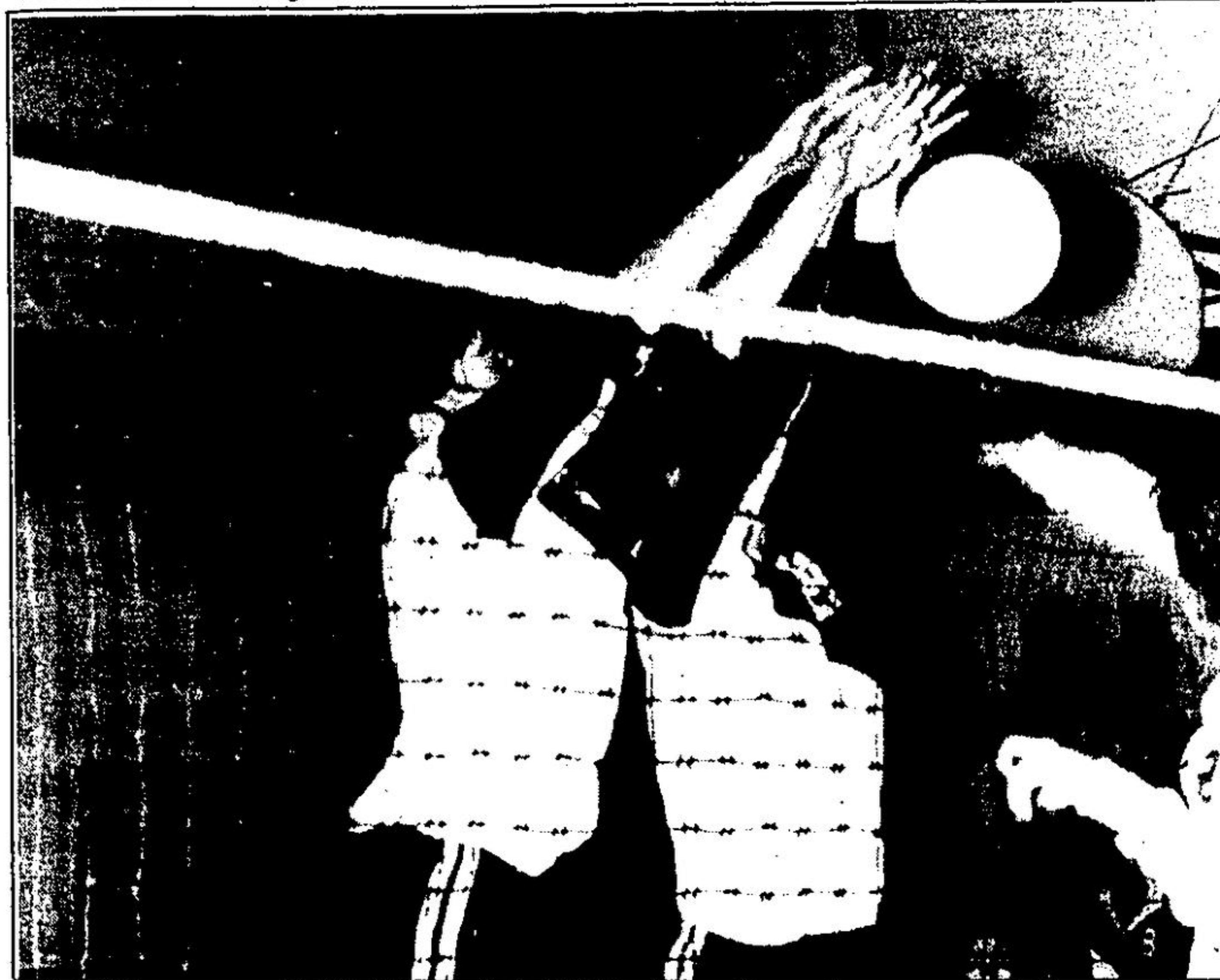
Pasma traded
