Volleyball Rebels vie for first

All three Rebel volleyball teams won their games this past week, putting each of them in good position to finish the regular season in first place.

Seniors defeated Bishop Reding 15-4, 8-15, 15-5 at GDHS Wednesday, giving the Royals their first loss of the year. Rebels

play E.C. Drury Feb. 6, while Reding must play Milton and Acton that week. If both teams are still tied, a tie breaker will be played Feb. 13, but a location has not been set at this time.

Juniors defeated Acton in two games Monday and knocked off Notre Dame 15-5, 15-11 at home

Wednesday. Juniors are now 7-1 with 11 points, in third place behind Bishop Reding and M.M. Robinson. The team plays last place Milton Feb. 4 and E.C. Drury Feb. 6, before the end of regular season play.

Midget volleyball Rebels became the first volleyball team

in Halton this season to win two tournaments. Acton and Milton had won their own tournaments in December, while Georgetown took its event Jan. 8.

Last Tuesday, Rebels won Bishop Reding's tournament, giving them a leg up on its other competitors as the championships at Acton High School on Feb. 12 approach. The team has one more tournament to play, scheduled for E.C. Drury Feb. 5.

Rebel swim team lost a meet against Queen Elizabeth Park by just two points at Georgetown Indoor Pool on Wednesday.

Coach Sharon Cook said her swimmers switched from their usual events (ie. from backstroke to fly) as a way of practicing for the Halton championships, scheduled for Feb. 14 at the Etobicoke Olympium. The team has one more meet before that, at White Oaks against the host team and Bishop Reding.

Rebel basketball teams continued to struggle last week. Juniors defeated Acton on the road Monday but were defeated Wednesday at Notre Dame. Midgets also beat Acton Monday and lost to Notre Dame on Wednesday.

Seniors played an exhibition game against Port Credit on Monday, losing 61-46 to the visitors. The team lost to Nelson in league play at home on Wednesday.

All three basketball teams will be hosting Milton Feb. 4 and E.C. Drury on Feb. 6, the last two games before the playoffs begin.

Powderpuff Registration

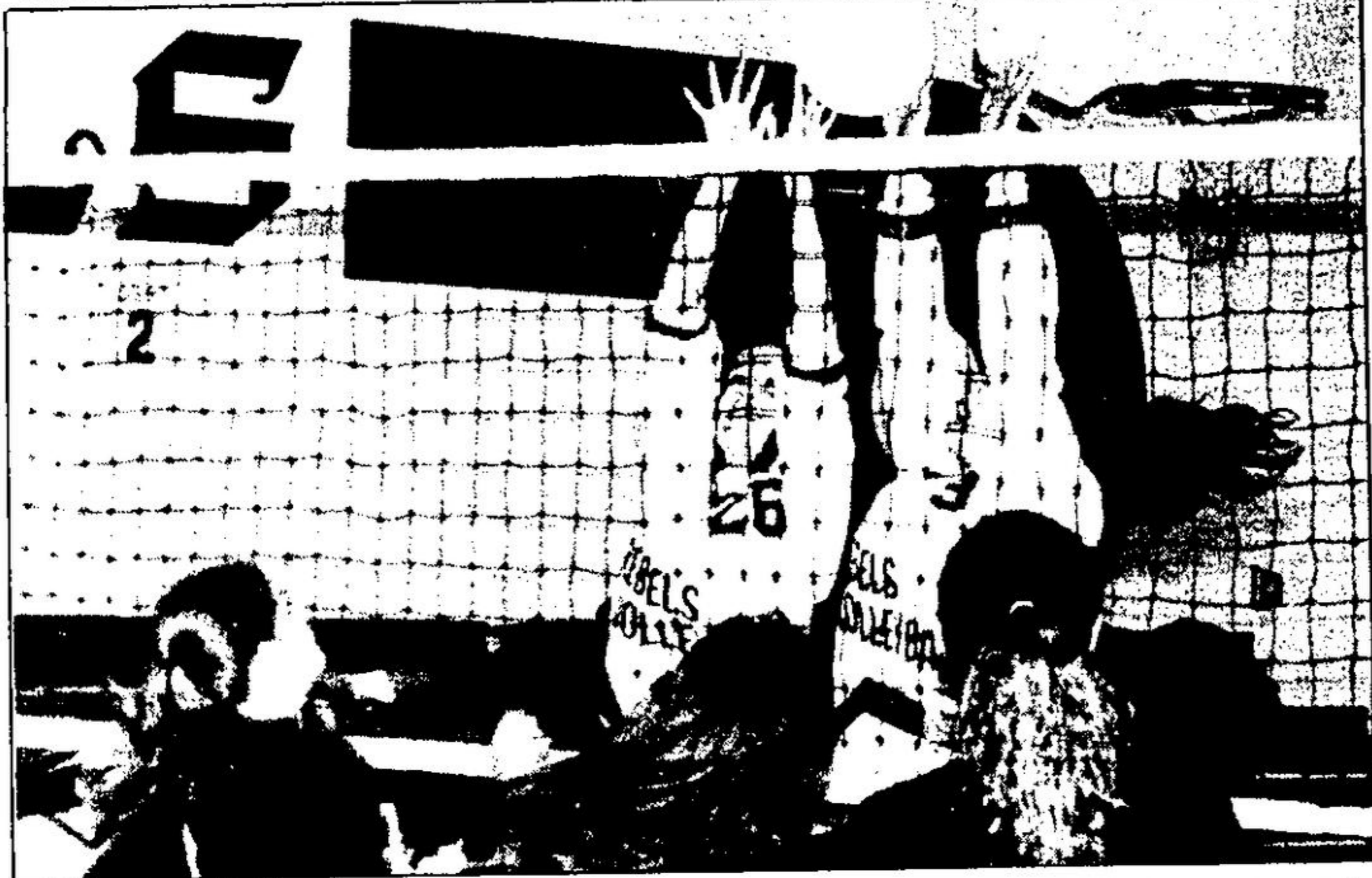
