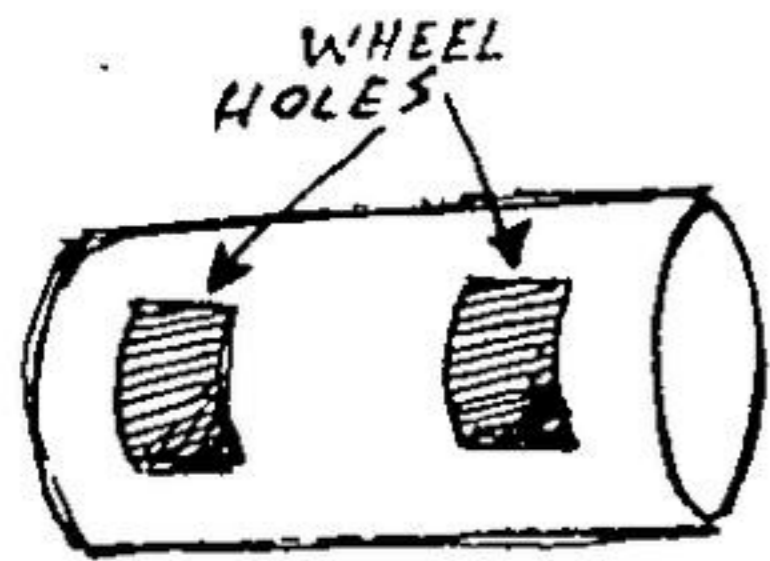
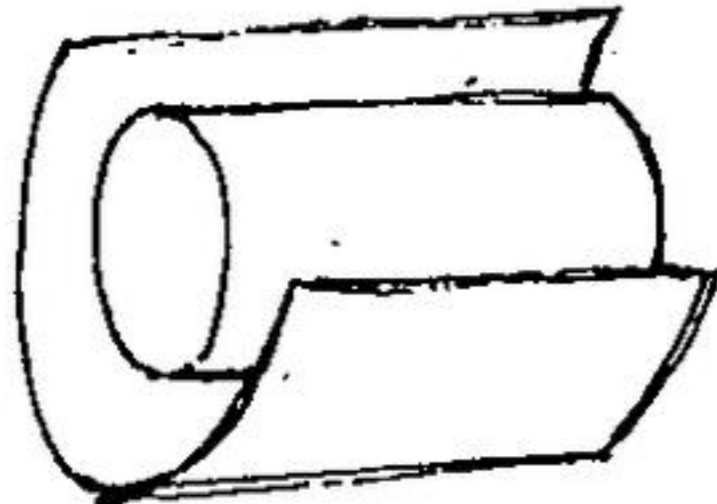


# OATSWAGON

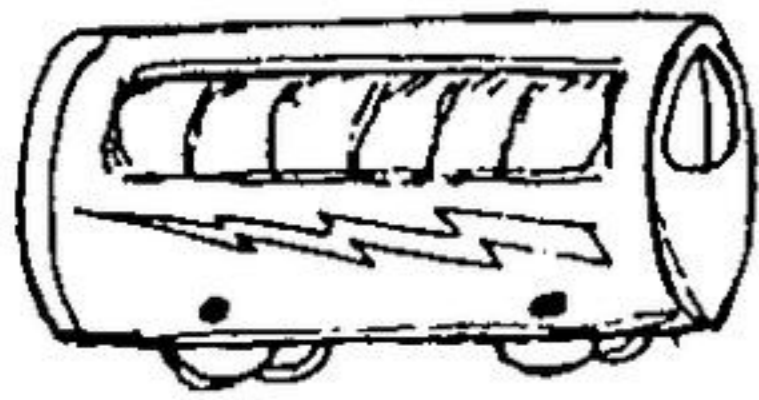
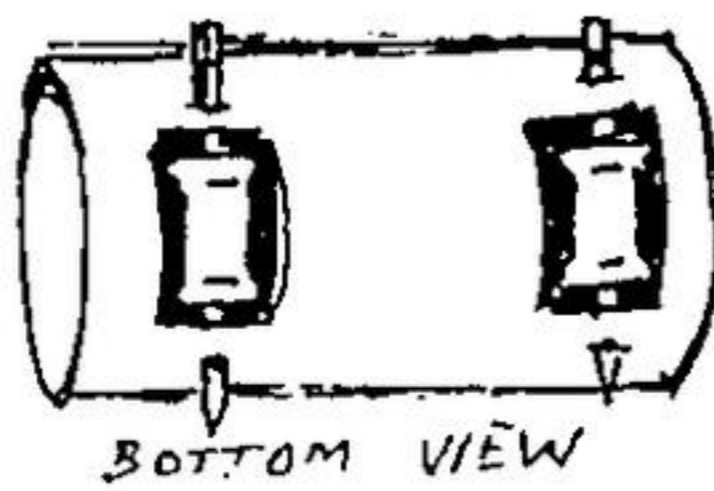
To build your own Oatswagon bus you'll need an oatmeal box, two empty thread spools, two pencils (or straight sticks), paper, and glue.

1. Cut the paper so that it will cover the oatmeal box completely, then glue the paper around the box.



2. Using sharp scissors, cut two wheel-holes in the bottom of your box as shown (you might want to get an adult to help with this). Each hole should be just a little larger than the size of the spool being used.

3. Add the spools (wheels) by pushing pencils through the box just above the wheel-holes, and sliding the spools onto the pencils.



4. The box top is the back door of your Oatswagon which is now ready for decorating.

## Math Mania

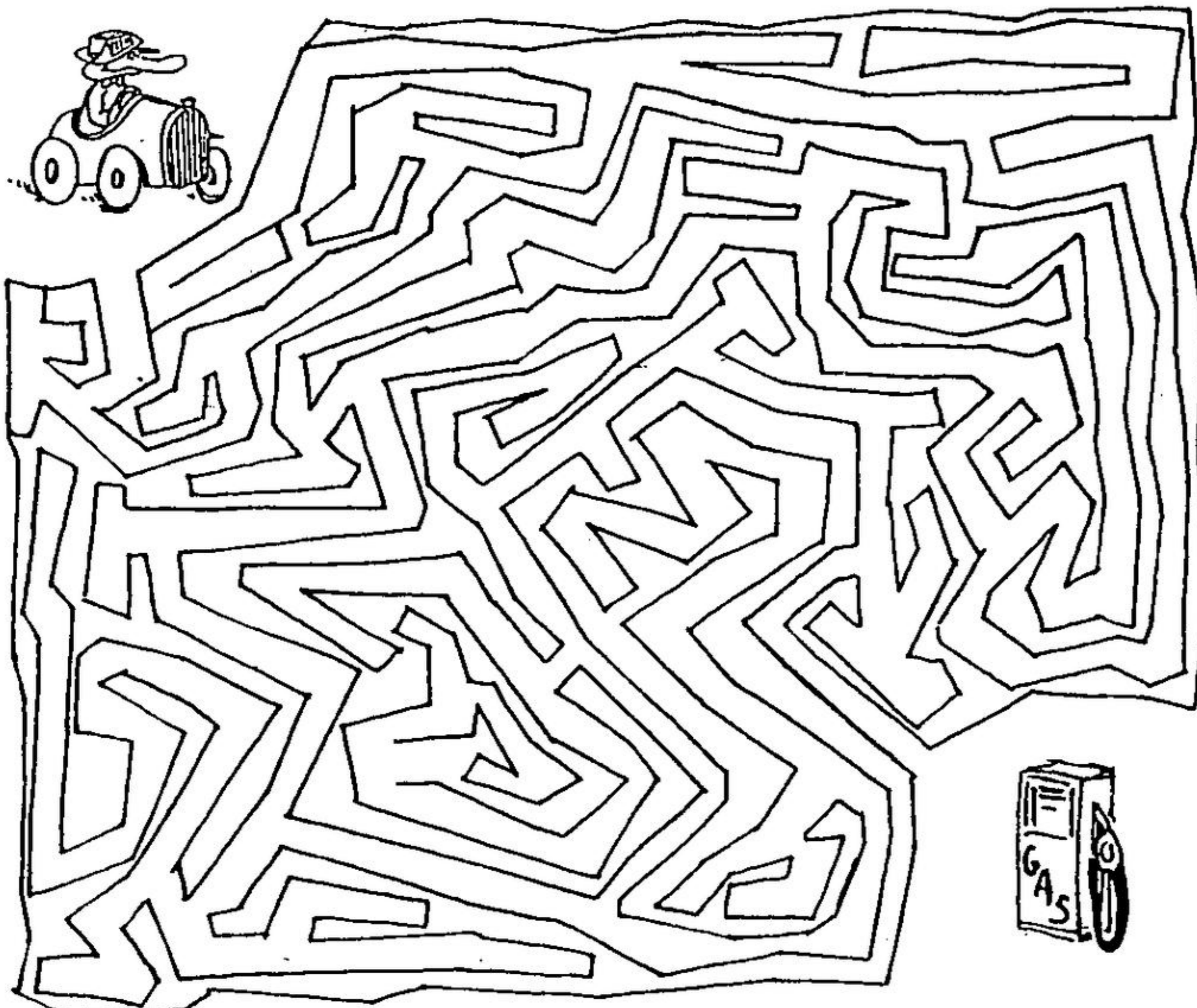
1. How tall is a flagpole which casts a 6 foot shadow when a 6 foot man casts a 3 foot shadow?
