
## New police officer patrolling Halton Hills

year-old Const. Jones has lived most of his life. He soon realized he'd like to follow the family tradition and become an officer himself.

"I'm a people person and like working with the public which is what a police officer does," said Const. Jones in a telephone interview before he was sworn in on Jan. 11 at the Burlington police detachment.

To become better suited for the profession, Const. Jones earned his Bachelor of Arts degree with concentrations on political science at the University of Guelph. "I majored in political science to get a better understanding of people and all the different cultures," said Const. Jones. "I thought it would help me become a better police officer."

He gained valuable experience for his future profession as a police officer working with the Niagara Parks Police as a Special Constable.

"I've always planned my jobs and education around my goal,"

he said.

police training.

"Police college was an eyeopening experience," he said. "You wouldn't believe all the information we have to learn."

Const. Jones officially began his duties on Wednesday under the direction of Const. Bill Henshaw. All new officers are put under the wing of a "coach" officer for about three months. He'll be required to write a coach officer's exam and if he successfully completes it, he'll be classified as a 4th class patrol ofconsideredand ficer knowledgeable and experienced enough to patrol on his own.

Const. Jones said he considers himself "very lucky to come up north."

He spent five weeks here as part of his training and appreciated the city atmosphere he detected in the area.

He found the abundance of countryside in the area "threw him for a loop with all the concessions and sideroads."

Now he's concentrating on getting to know the area along with all the services available in the community to increase his ability in a job he knew he always wanted.
