Weaving an ancient art

If you are interested in learning to weave you are about to learn an ancient art. Weaving goes back 20,000 years or more and was used by the Ancient Greeks, Egyptians and North American Indian tribes. The Credit Valley Artisans are offering a five week weaving course for beginners on Wednesdays starting February 6th. Georgetown resident Joanna Dobbin will be the instructor.

Mrs. Dobbin has woven for over 11 years and has taken weaving courses through Sheridan College and the Ontario

Handweavers and Spinners. Currently she is busy working on her thesis to complete her Master Weaver designation. Mrs. Dobbin enjoys weaving with linen and silks in particular. Mrs. Dobbin is Regional Director (Midwest Ontario) for the Ontario Handweavers and Spinners and is a member of the Heritage Handweavers guild of the Credit Valley Artisans.

Students will learn to warp a loom and weave plain, twill and hucklace weaves. Four harness looms owned by the Credit Valley Artisans will be used by the

students. Several samples of the different weaves will be created by the students for future reference. Each student will weave a tablemat as a project.

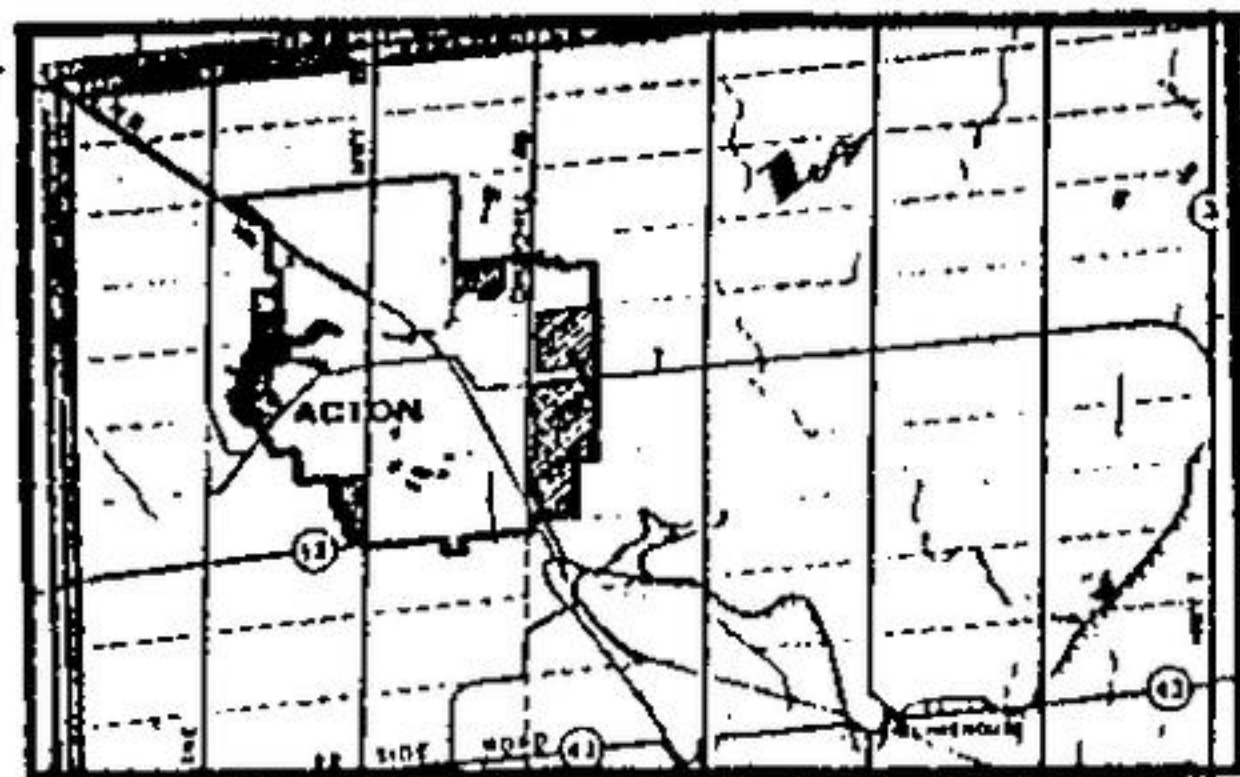
