Lumber team faces elimination

Georgetown Beaver Lumber AA Major Novice team faced elimination in the Ontario Minor Hockey League playdowns at Orangeville last night (Tuesday).

The local team had lost their first two games of the best of five series on the weekend dropping the opening match 2-1 on Jan. 26 at Orangeville and the other game 4-0 Jan. 27 at home.

If Georgetown won Tuesday's game (results unavailable at press time), the series would continue later this week at Alcott Arena.

The first period on Jan. 26 saw Jason Campbell open the scoring at the 10:45 mark, assisted by Scott Ellis to set the tone for the Georgetown club.

Roddy Heinz who played a standout game for the Lumbermen, broke up an offensive threat by the Lions at the 13:34 mark. Tyler Pearce made four key saves in the middle of the first period to keep the score in Georgetown's favour.

Orangeville got a clear

breakaway at the 16:58 mark of the second from the blueline and made no mistake with a great deke move that Pearce had no chance on.

The second period ended 1-1. The third period saw Bryan Stuttard, Ryan Bobor and Hayes apply good offensive work as Georgetown continued to dominate.

Orangeville broke the tie at the 14:28 mark with an excellent wrist shot from the slot just under the cross bar which Ryan Carter tried in vain to stop.

The final four minutes saw Georgetown try hard to find the equalizer, but were unable to do so.

The next day saw Orangeville quickly jump in front with three fast goals within the first five minutes.

Dan Smith found himself all alone at the 15:33 mark, only to be turned away after Smith put a deke on the goalie. Brent McClung forced the Orangeville goaltender to come up big again

at the 16:40 mark with a pad save. The first period ended 3-0.

The second period saw both teams play clean hockey with even balance on both sides. Ryan Bobor, Jason Campbell and Mathew Hotham all had good scoring opportunities for Georgetown.

Georgetown applied pressure for the balance of the period but could not buy a goal. Roddy Heinz and Brent McClung also were turned away by Orangeville as the second period ended 3-0.

The third period found Ryan Carter, the Georgetown goalie in the second half come up big to keep the score at 3-0. Finally Orangeville scored the last goal of the game at the 15:00 mark on a scramble type play.

The Lumbermen tried to get back into the game, but the first five minutes had sealed their fate.
