"The Board and its students and staff benefit from the improved air quality," noted Cliff Byrnes, Director of Education. "The greatly reduced operating costs and the improved payback for the installation further save the Board money and assists us in meeting the financial realities of the '90s."

Ontario Hydro benefits by the improved electrical efficiency of their system.

Ontario Hydro's participation is part of its energy management direction. The aim is to substantially reduce consumer electrical demand by means of a variety of information and incentive programs. The Savings By Design program, which funded this project, offers funding to cover the cost of feasibility studies for energy efficiency improvements and to subsidize the cost of implementation. The amount of funding available is determined based on potential energy savings.

The Board is committed to providing a healthy and safe environment in all of its facilities for its staff and students. It is currently investigating making further use of this and other Hydro programs in an effort to improve the operation of its facilities. This includes evaluating energy efficient lighting systems which has the potential to provide in excess of 700 kW (kilowatts) of electrical savings.
