Sheridan offers technology program

To prepare students for the environmental challenges of the '90s and beyond, Sheridan College is introducing a new technology program which offers a strong environmental science component: Chemical Engineering Technology - Environmental.

With the first enrolment intake set for September 1991 at the Brampton Campus, Chemical Engineering Technology - Environmental students will study chemical engineering technology, environmental regulations, occupational health and safety, solid waste treatment, waste water treatment, waste audit, air pollution chemistry, microbiology, and technical report (environmental).

This three-year, co-operative education program combines related, paid work experience with classroom theory and laboratory practice. Graduates may find employment opportunities with environmental

consulting firms, as trouble shooters for companies with pollution problems, as government inspectors, or in analysis laboratories.

"As government legislation and regulations continue to move toward tougher environmental standards, there will be an increase in the demand for technologists in the fields of waste management and environmental science," said Chair, Engineering Technology, Bill Costigane (Brampton Campus).

Currently, there are over 3,000 environmental service and equipment firms operating in Canada, and a federal government report estimates that \$58 billion will be spent on pollution control in Canada over the next 10 years.

"The majority of environmental problems are chemical-based pollution problems. In the years ahead, chemists, chemical engineers, and chemical technologists and technicians will

play a significant role in resolving the environmental problems of the world," said Costigane.

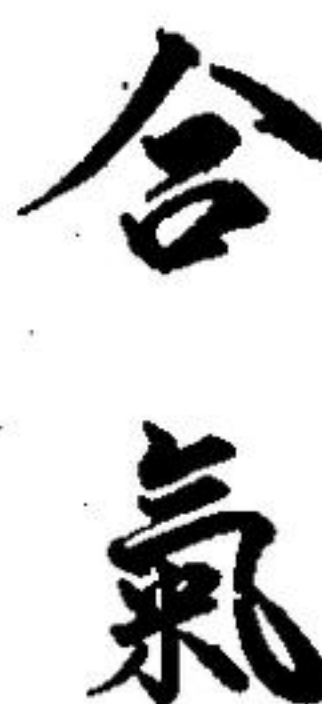

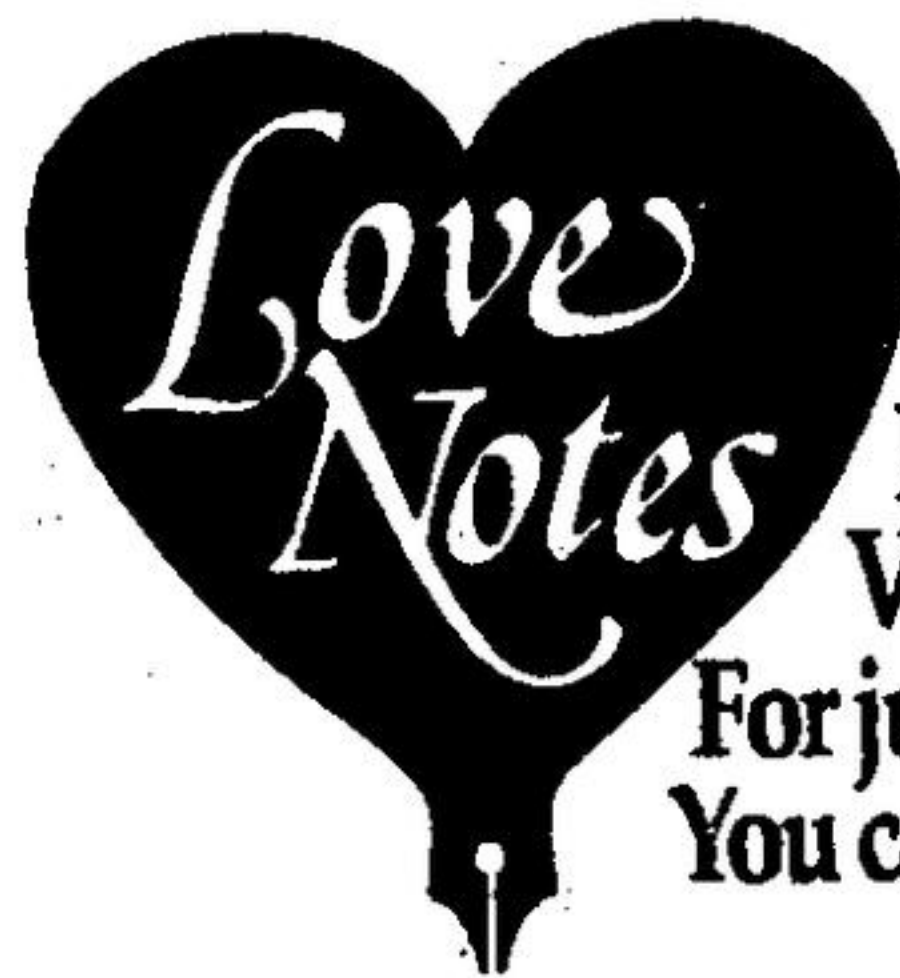
