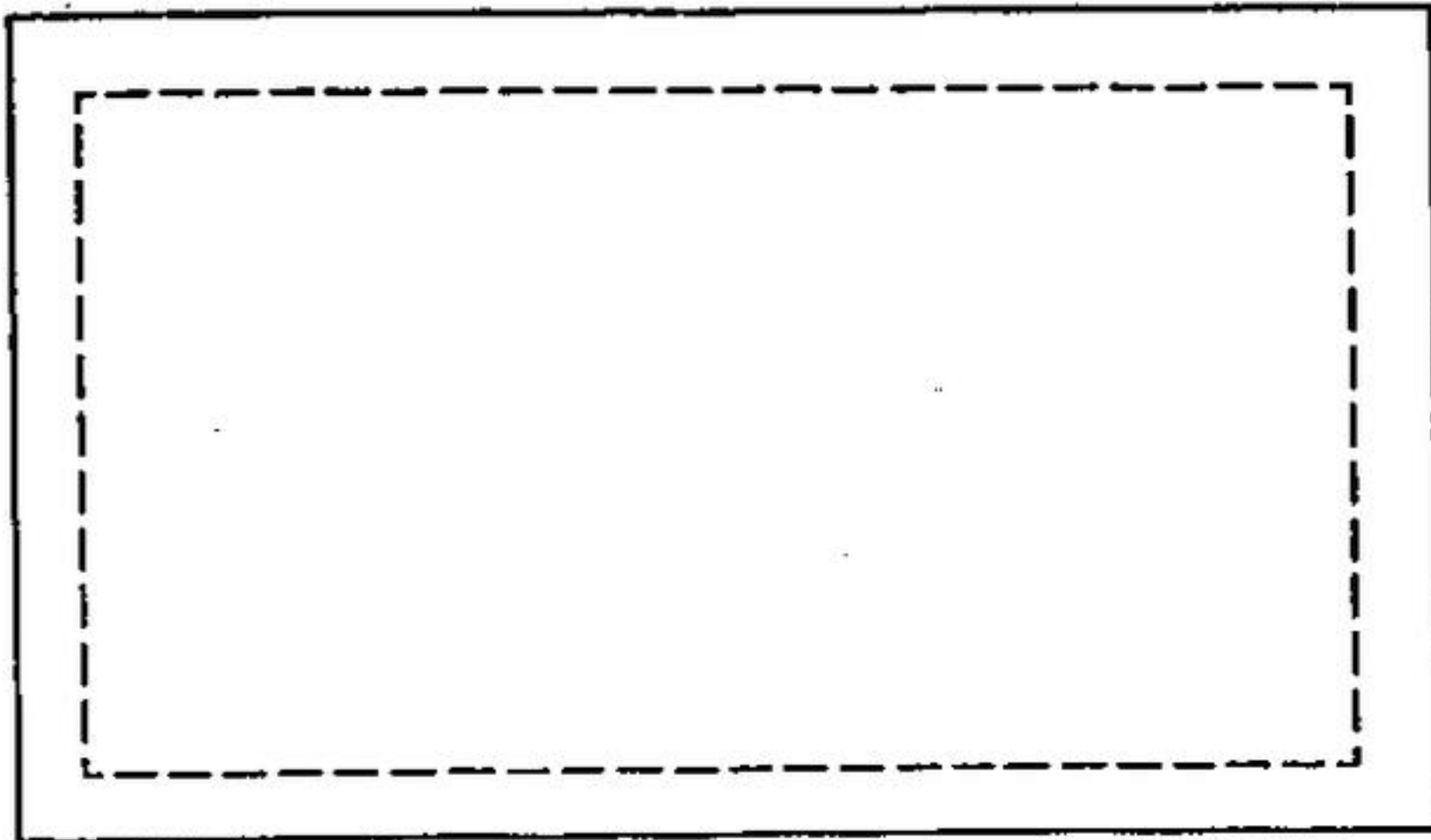

SHOPPING SMART

Supermarket shelves are full of the food, snacks, and household goods families need and want. Sometimes there are so many, it's hard to know which products are the best "buys." Many supermarkets provide important information that will help you decide which products offer the best "deal."

Suppose you want to invite a few friends over this Friday and you need to buy some chips. As you shop, look for labels on the shelves that look like these.

Potato Chips



Notice that the labels tell you how much the product costs and how much it costs for each unit — price per pound, ounce, or pint. The unit price helps shoppers compare the value of different products.

- The bigger bag of chips has the lower unit cost. Why do people buy the smaller bags?
- Which bag of chips would you buy for your party?

Possible Ans: 1. People buy the smaller bag because it cost less per bag. 2. I would buy the larger bag because you get more chips for your money.
