The affable Mr. Coombs said between shows, it's the older people who grew up with Casey and Finnegan who are not taking the puppets' retirement easily.

For the past year the two have been making fewer appearances on the 25-year-old CBC preschooler television show as a way of introducing new puppets, said Mr. Coombs. When this first started to happen, explained Mr. Coombs, "we mostly received mail from older people. They can't imagine Casey and Finnegan not being a part of their lives."

New puppets already introduced on the show include Chester the Crow and Truffles "a pink fluffy creature."

Asked why Finnegan and Casey were leaving the spotlight, Mr. Coombs replied, "their mother is retiring." Judith Lawrence, the puppets creator and puppeteer wants to take on new challenges, he said.

Mr. Coombs appears to be taking the retirement in stride. "It's been like working with somebody for 25 years, it's definitely something you take note of."

Mr. Dress-up grew out of a now defunct children's television show called Butternut Square. He joined the Butternut cast in the mid 60's and this marked the beginning of the relationship between Mr. Coombs, Casey and his canine sidekick.

In 1967 Mr. Dress-up first graced the airways, said Mr. Coombs.

As for Mr. Coombs retiring, children and parents shouldn't worry.

"I'm not ready to retire and I plan to go on as long as I enjoy what I'm doing," he said.
