

Agriculture Federation 50 year celebration

The Halton Region Federation of Agriculture was formed in 1941, 50 years ago. This country had just come through the hungry 30's and found itself with a war on its hands and many people looking for food.

Canada not only supplied food but also her farm sons. Prices were going up and the mechanization on farms was just beginning. It was a period when many farm groups were forming to help the farmer produce all he could to help win the war.

Since its inception in 1941, the Federation has endeavoured to coordinate the activites of various agricultural organizations in Halton and to serve the farmers by providing a unified voice to all levels of government in Canada and especially Ontario on agricultural issues and con-

Over the years, H.F.A. has been responsible for a number of achievements. In association with the Ontario Federation of Agriculture, many of the commodity groups were organized to deal with the production and marketing of agricultural products.

The Federation was one of the first groups to recognize the need for conserving and preserving good agricultural land, also for the recreational needs of the rural residents. In 1947 the Halton Federation of Agriculture pur-

chased 35 acres of Lowville and developed the Halton Community Centre which is now Lowville Park.

The Federation in the 40's became actively involved in many social events such as garden parties, school field days, horseshoe pitching, church services and music festivals, to promote goodwill among the farmers in Halton.

In the last two decades, the Federation has changed to meet the needs of the farming community. The Federation is now responsible for the co-ordination of almost all funding from the Regional government to local agricultural groups and organizations. It is also a resource for the farm community to use on problems and concerns.

The Federation of Agriculture with Ontario Federation of Agriculture has fought hard to make the concerns of the farm community known to all governments.

In the last 10 years the Federation has been visible in an attempt to preserve agricultural land, to develop the Agricultural Code of Practice, to make recommendations on Hydro Corridors and to work on planning assessment and taxation issues.

In the 50 years of history there has been 18 presidents and in 1991 we have our first lady president in Linda Cullingham, starting another 50 years of service.


